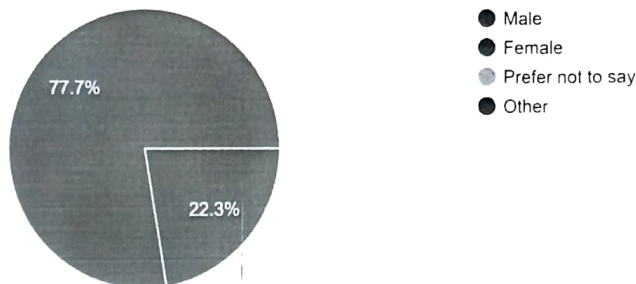

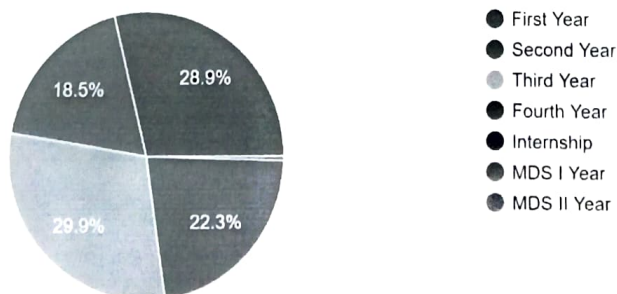

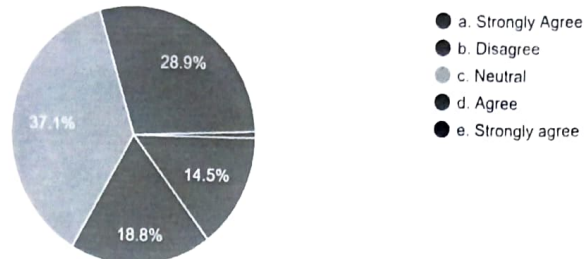

1. Does the current content of the syllabus adequately meet the needs of the dental industry and bridge the gap between dental standards and global standards?

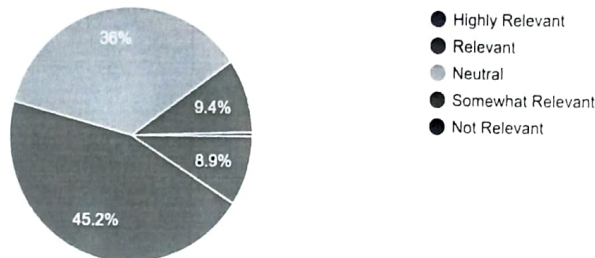

2. How would you assess the relevance of the course content to real-world dental practice?

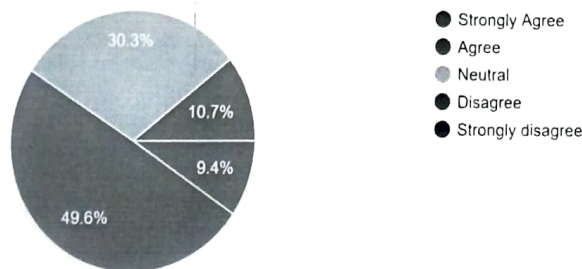

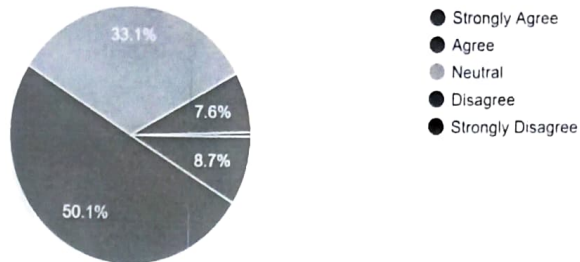

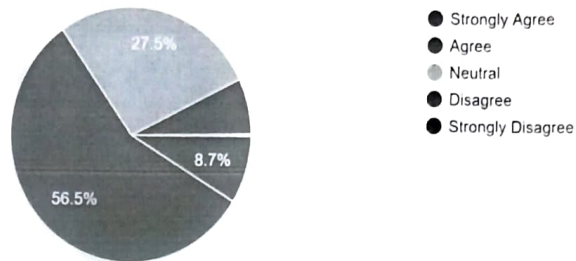

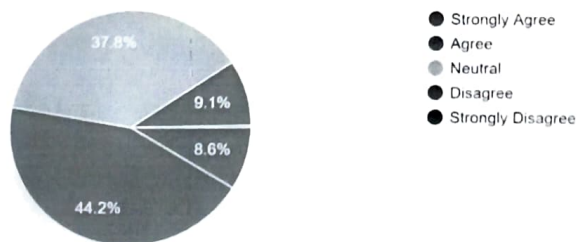

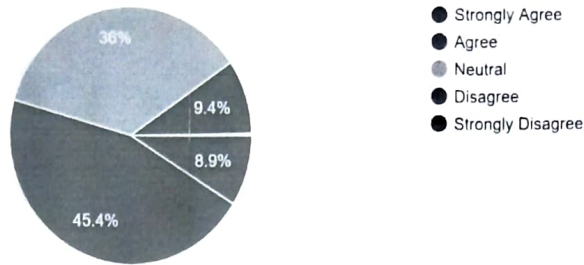

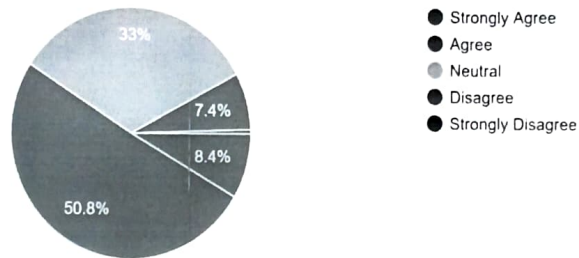

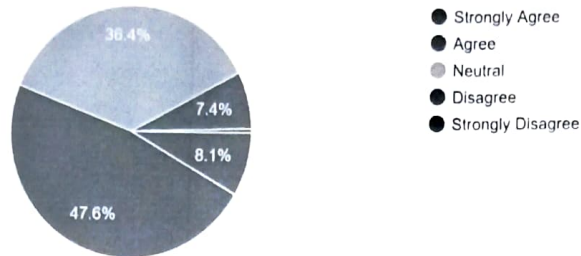

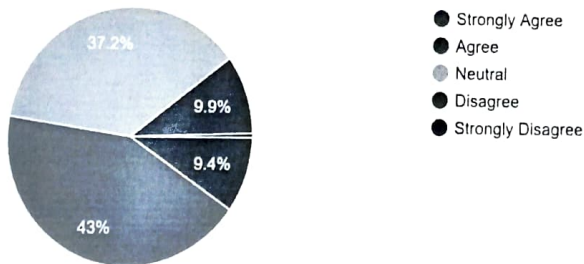



1. The curriculum provides sufficient skills to solve problems encountered at work.

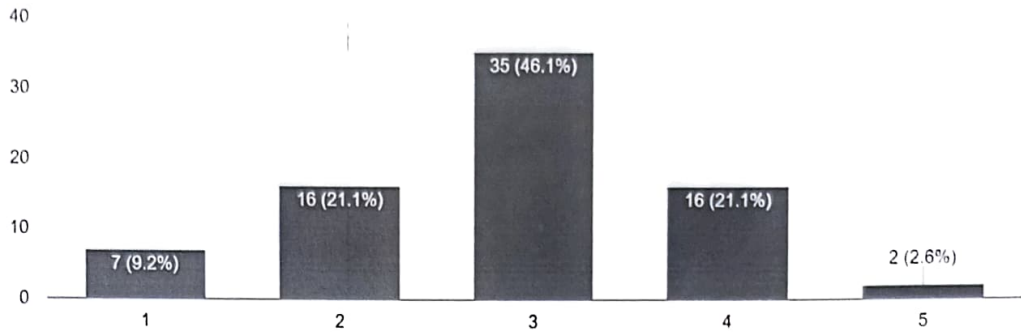

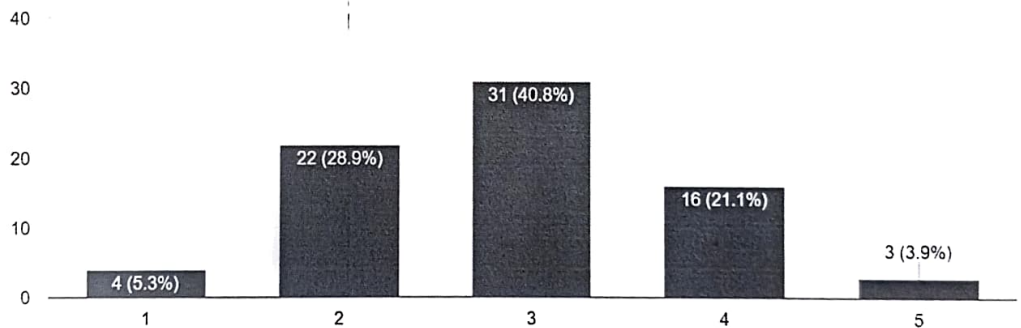

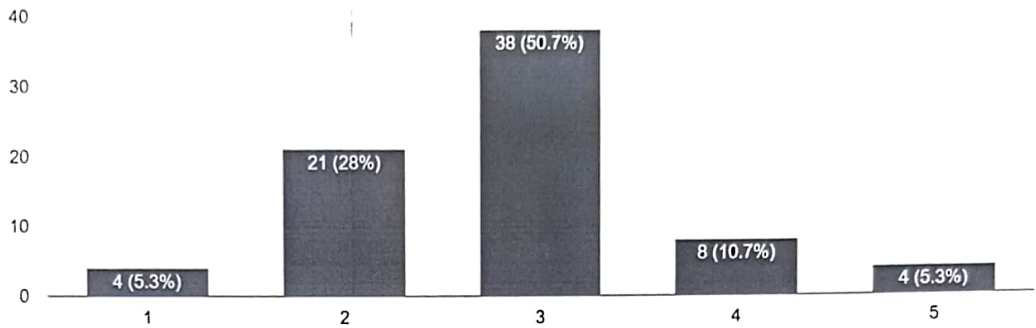

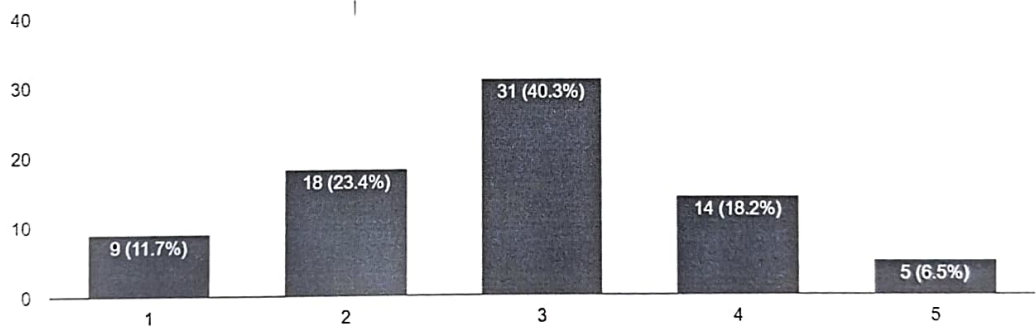

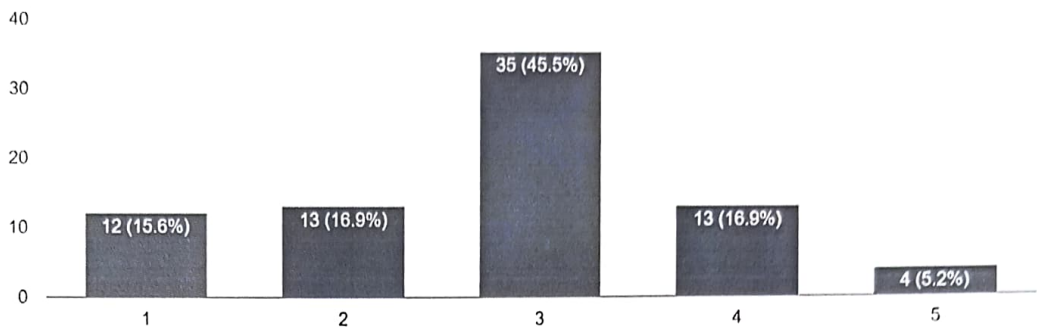

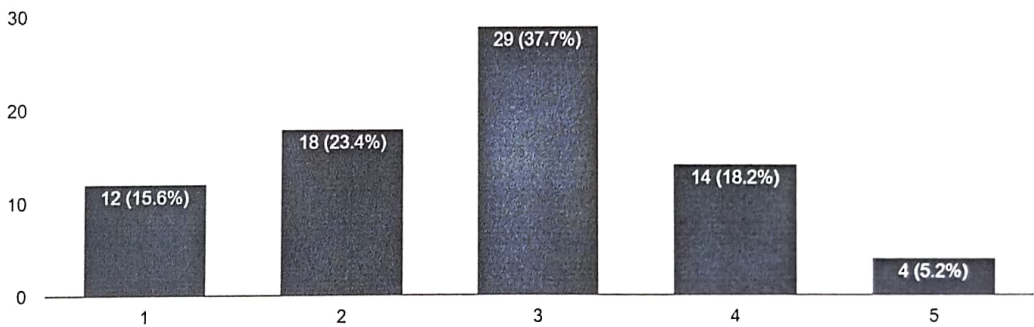

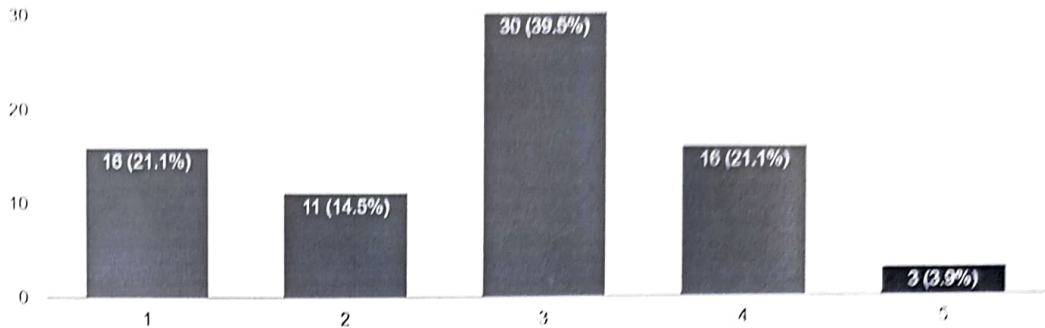

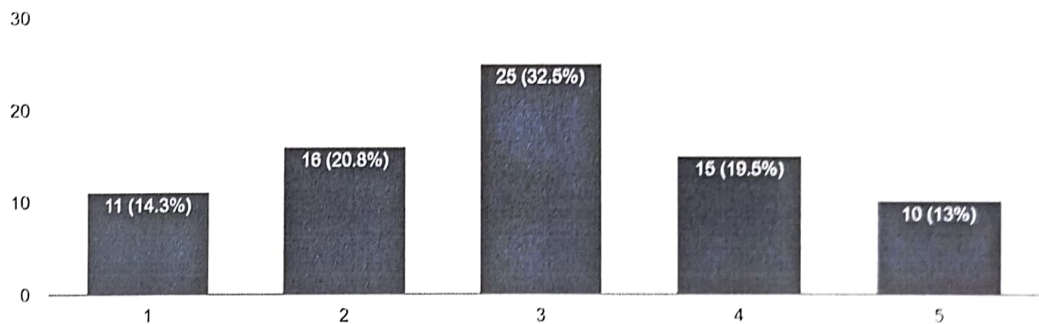

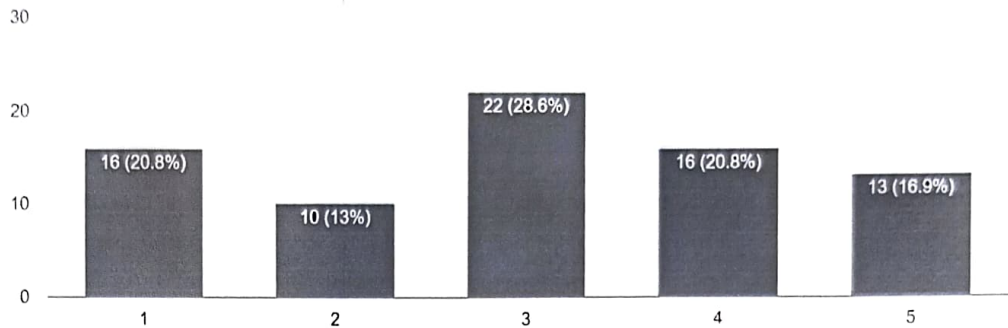

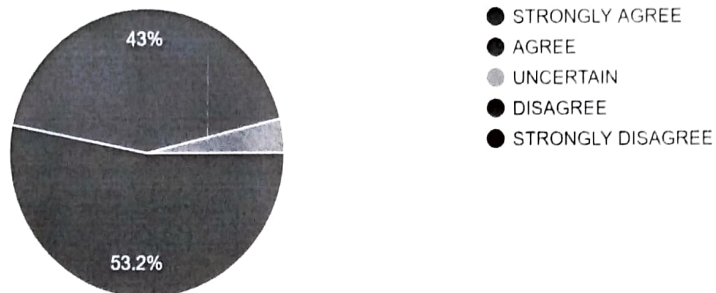

The chart shows that 43% of teachers agree, 53.2% are in strong agreement, that the curriculum Curriculum has a good balance of theory and practical exposure.

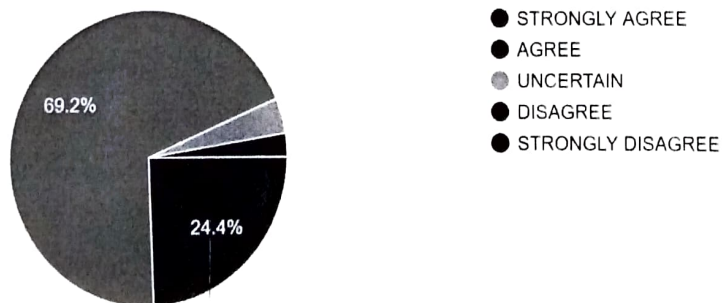

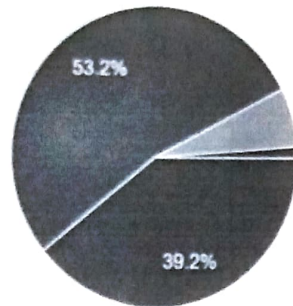

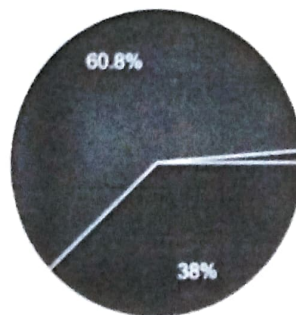

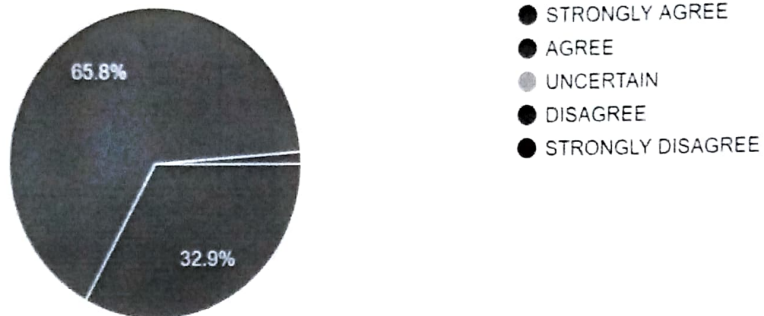

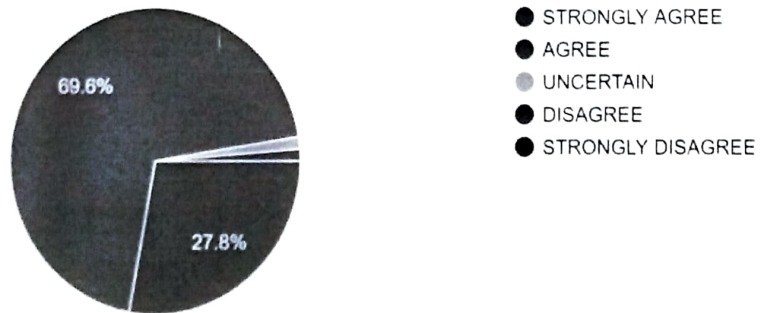

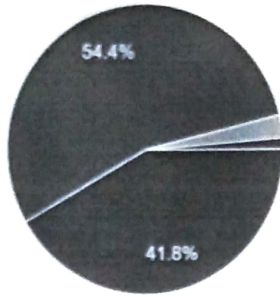

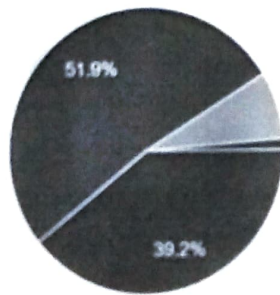

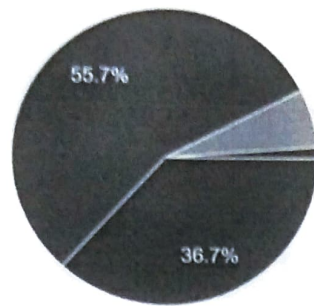

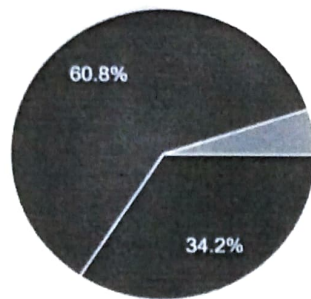

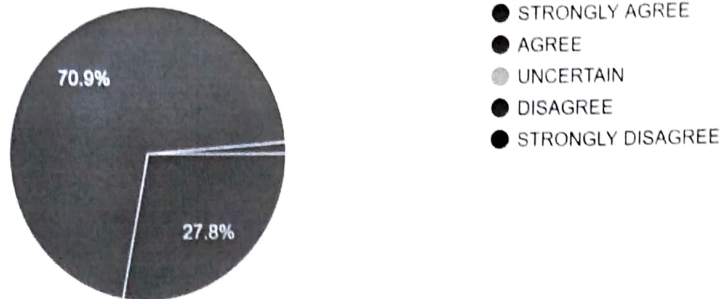

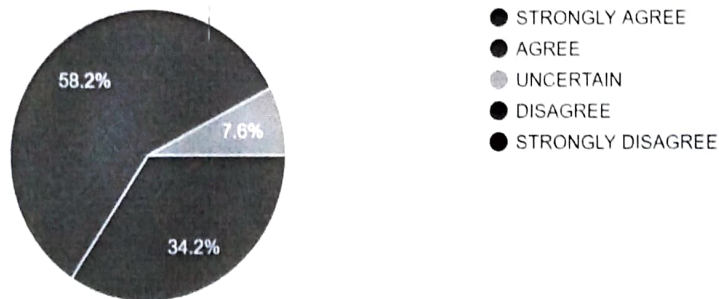

1. Is the curriculum aligned with the requirements of the course?

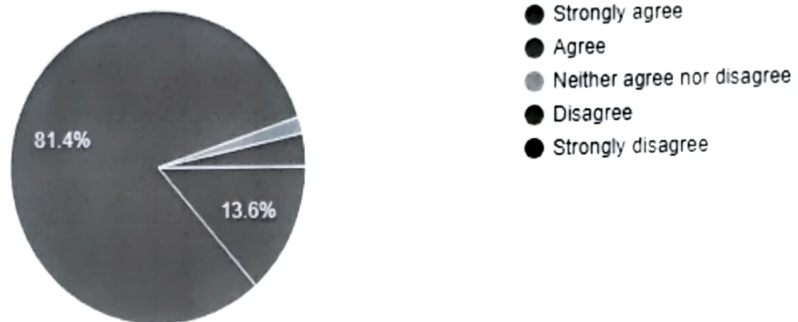

2. Does the curriculum address the local, national, regional, and global healthcare needs effectively?

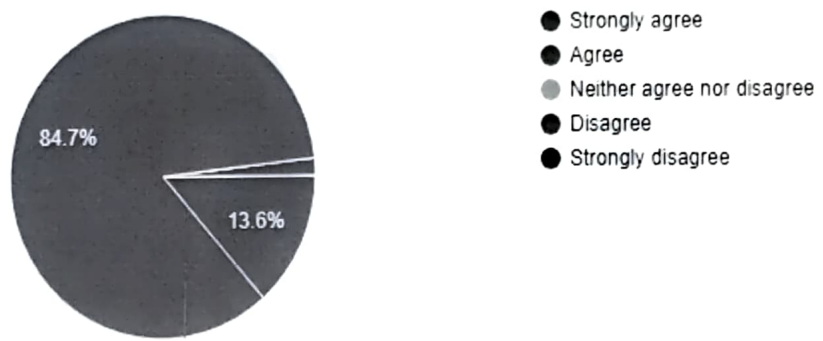

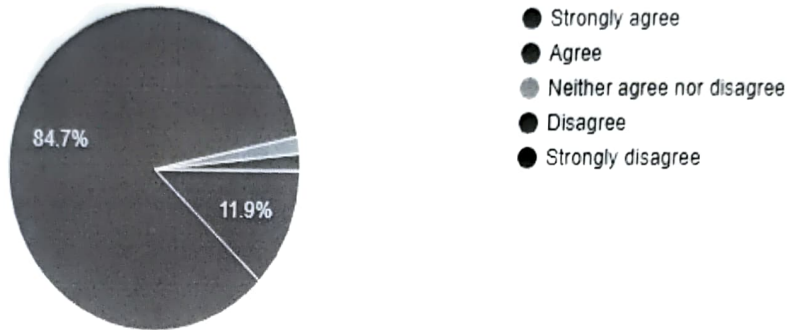

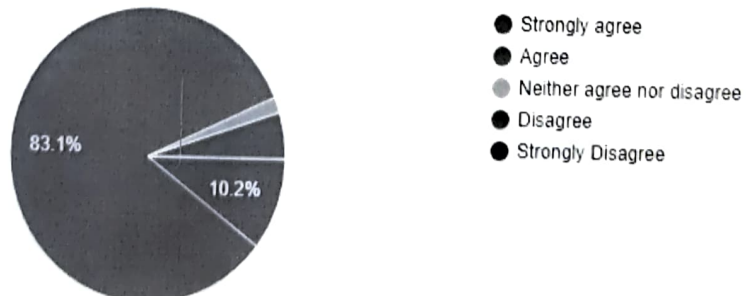

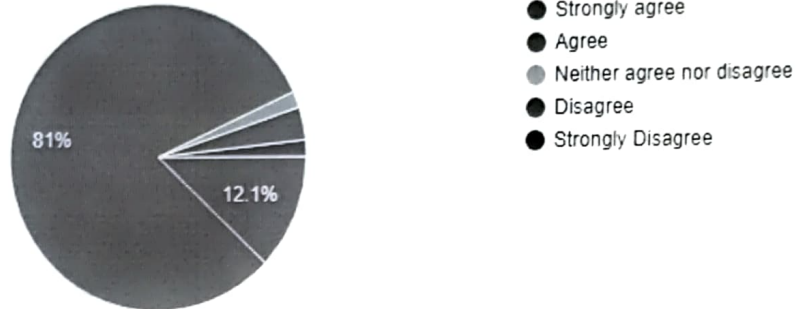

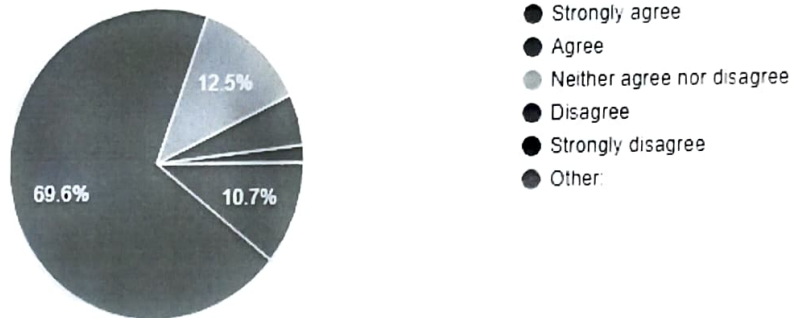

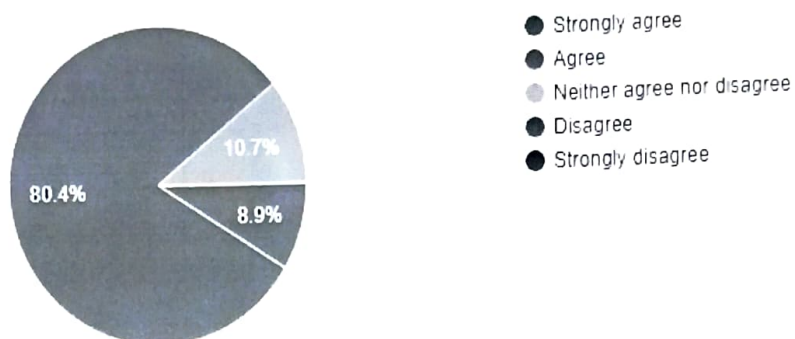

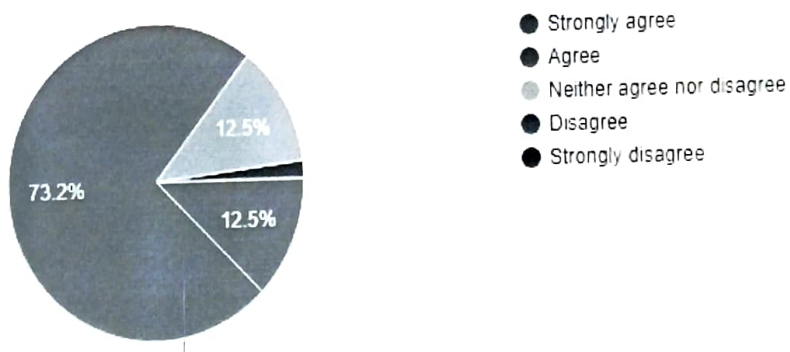

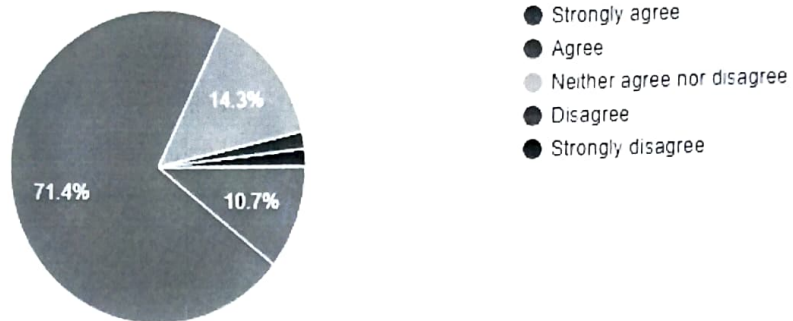

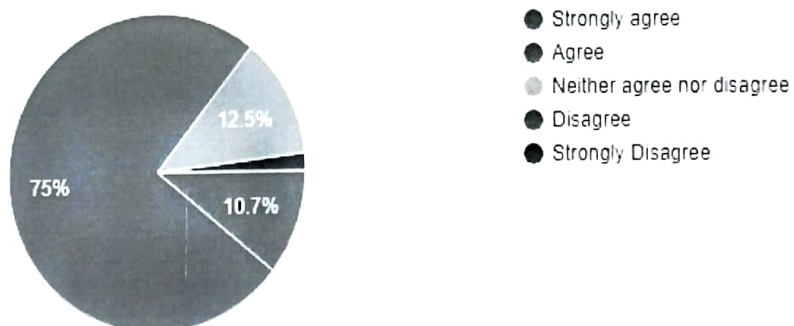

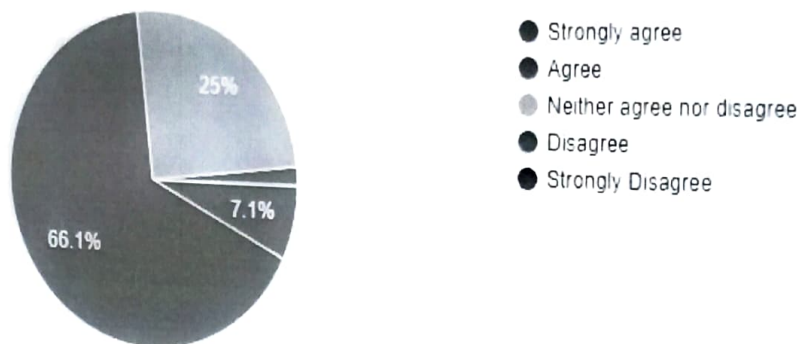

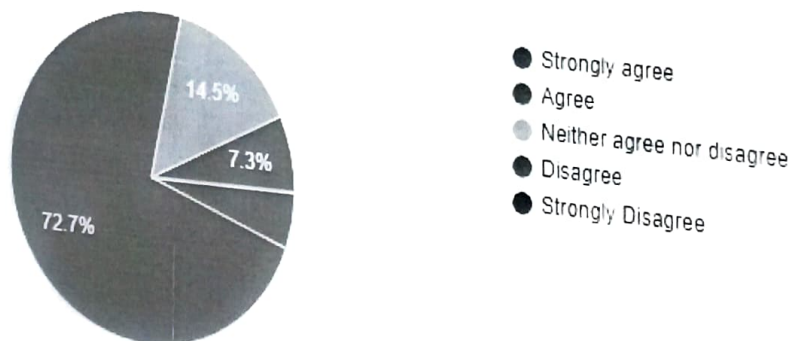

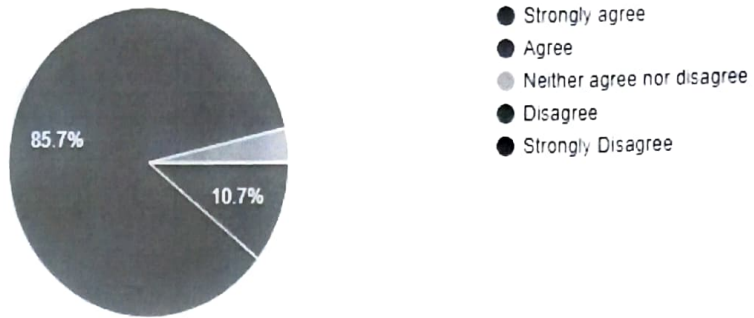

- Strengthen the aspects of the curriculum that emphasize competency, employability, and human values, as 7.1% strongly agreed and 66.1% agreed, while 25% were neutral and 1.8% disagreed.
- Address the concerns of the 1.8% who disagreed to enhance alignment with competency and development goals.

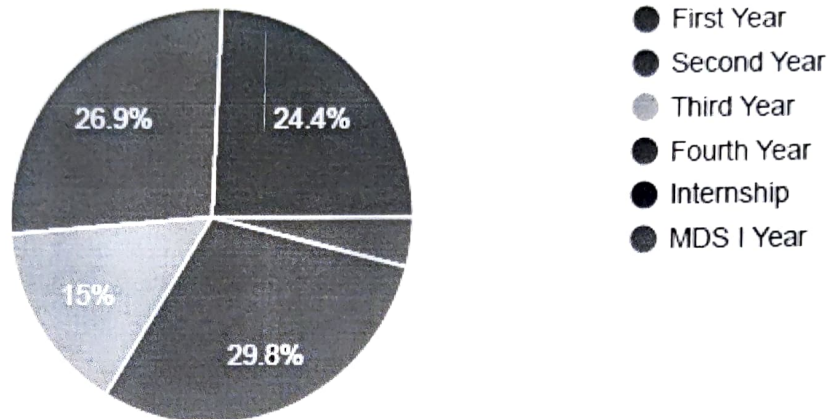

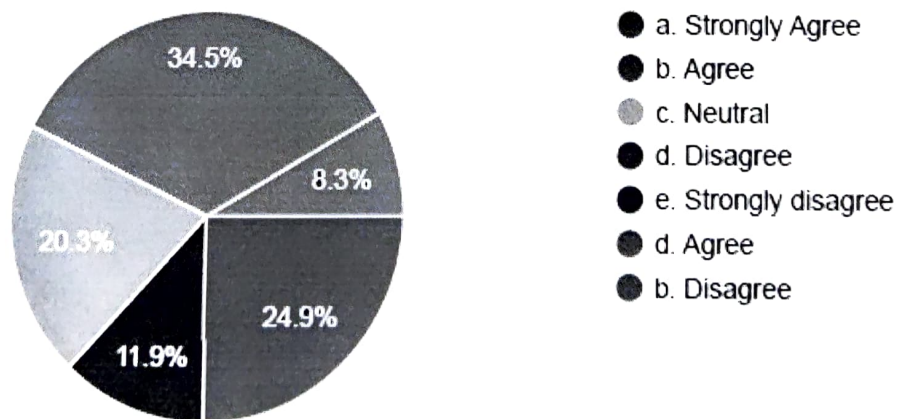

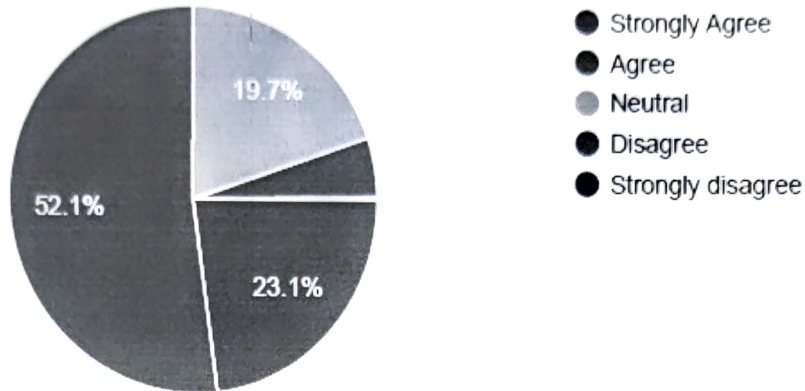

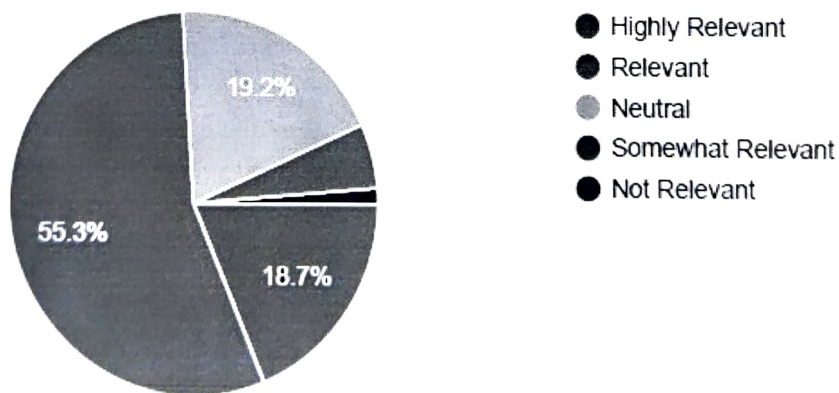

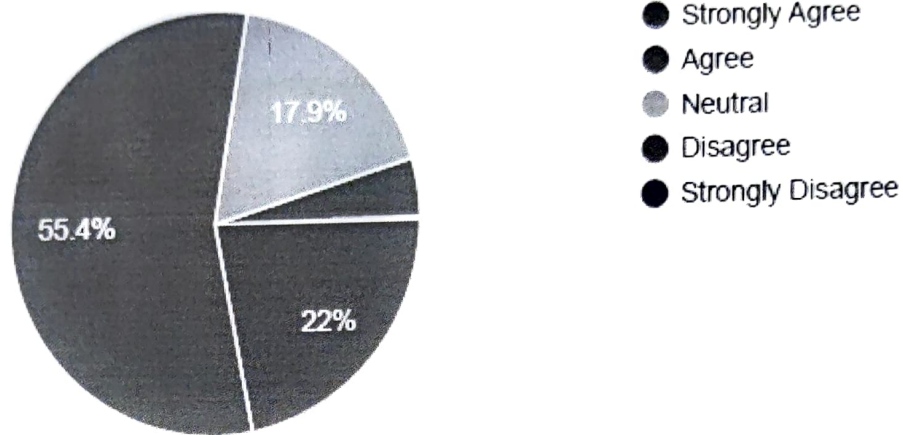

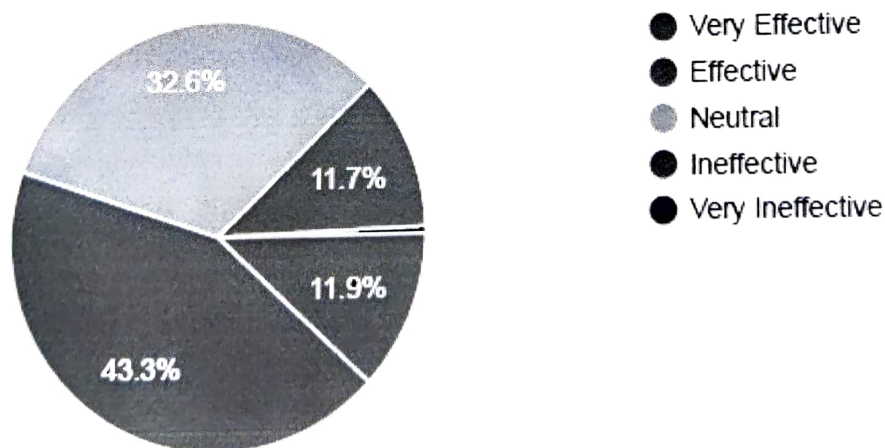

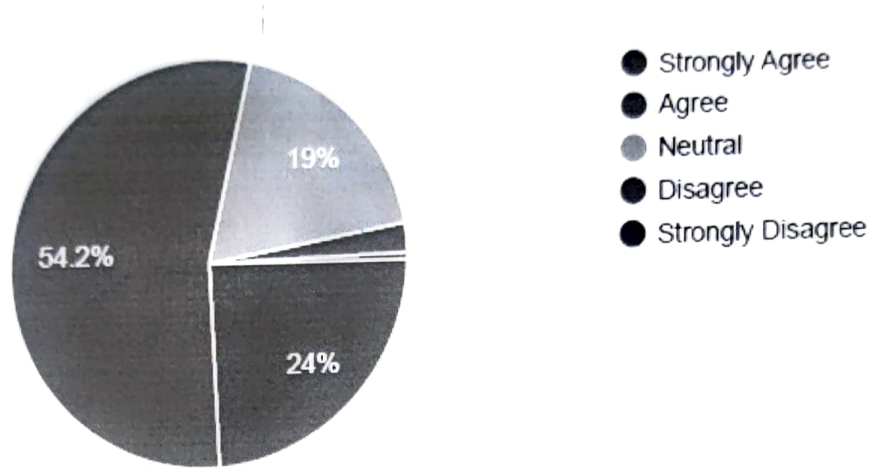

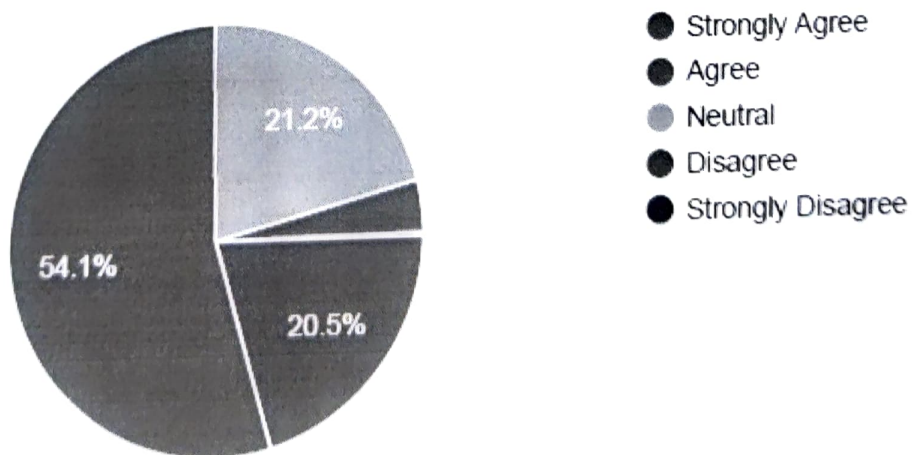

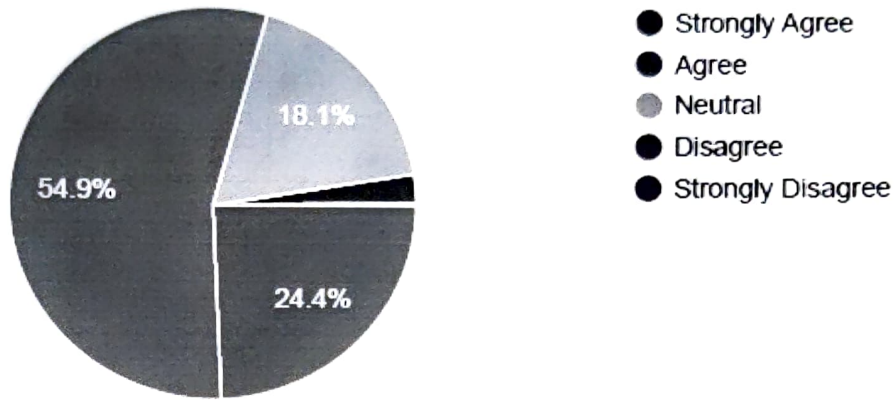

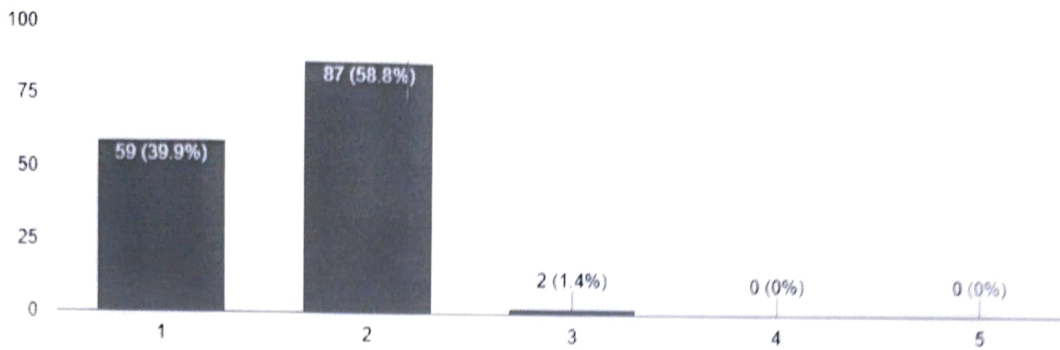

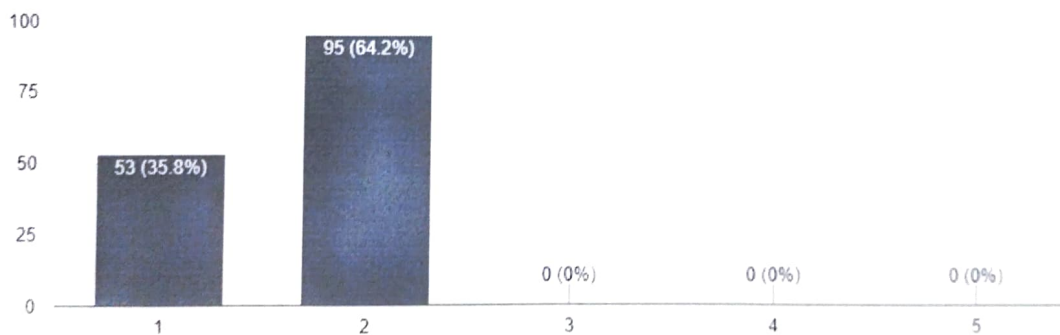

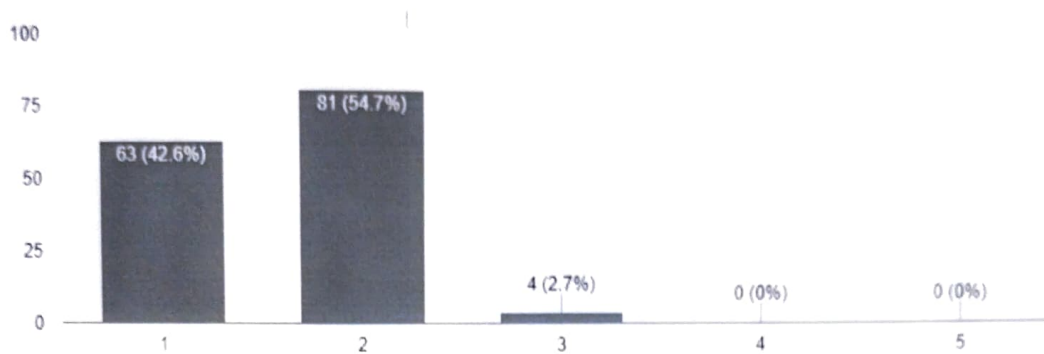

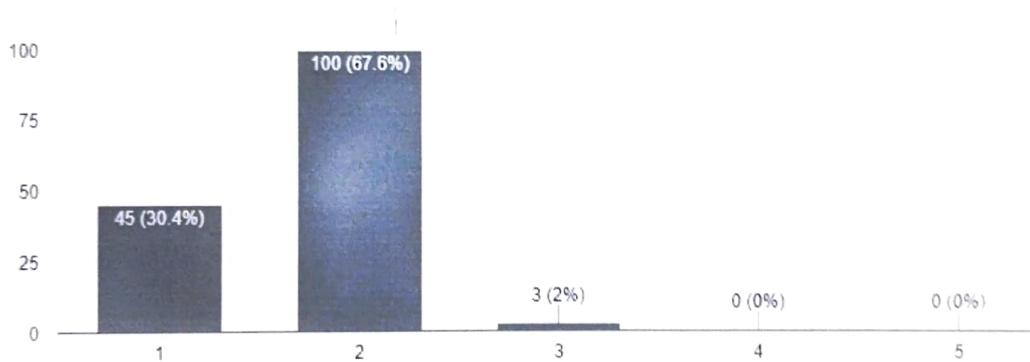

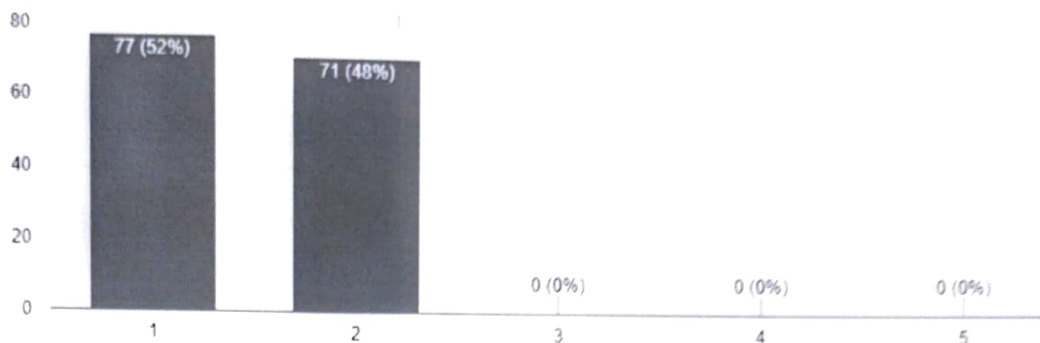

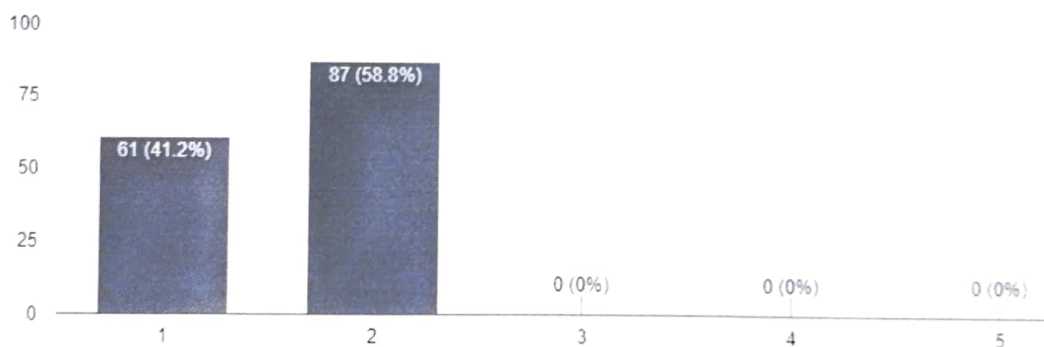

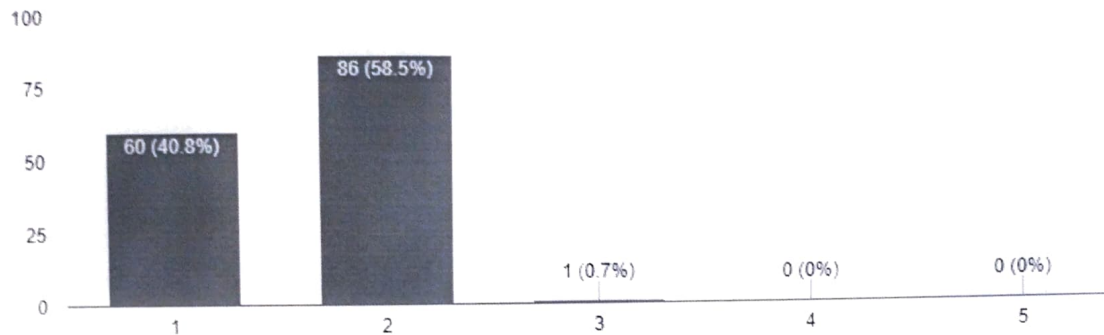

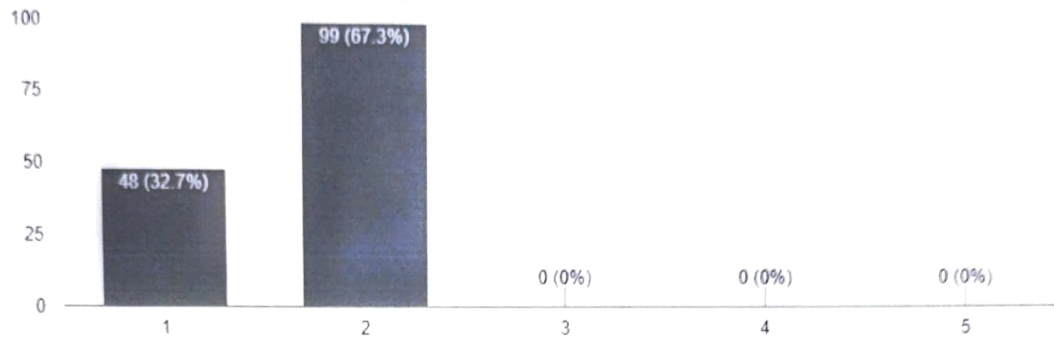

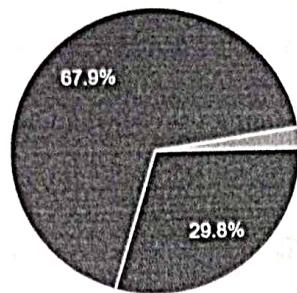

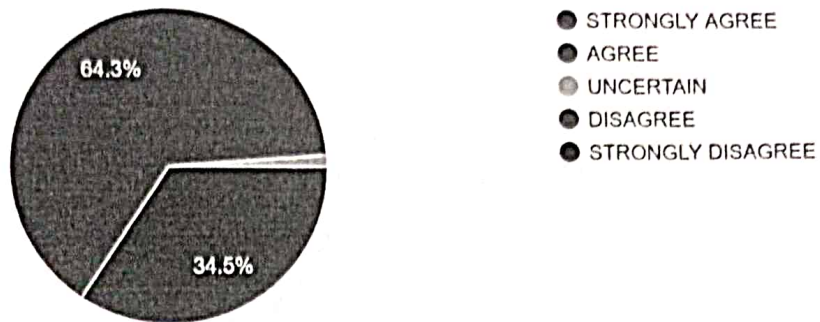

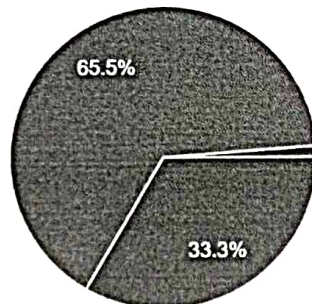

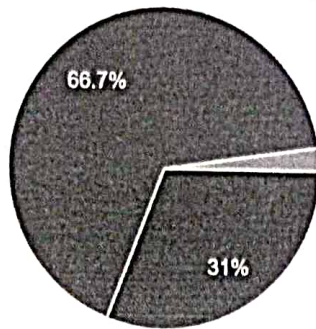

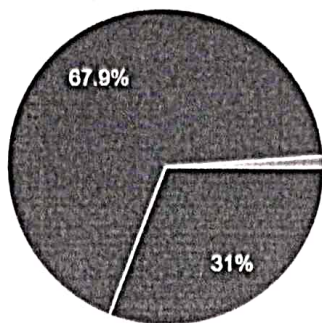

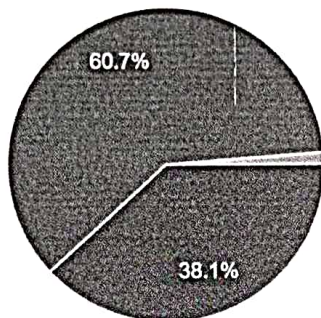

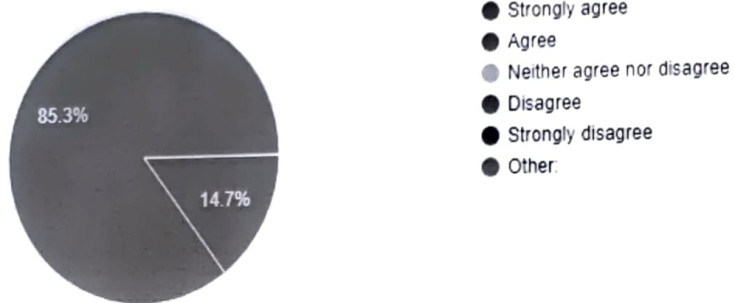

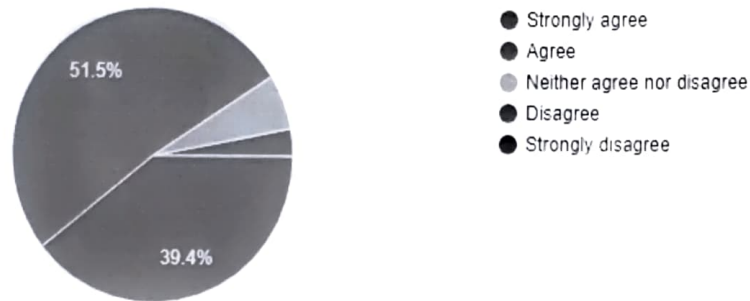

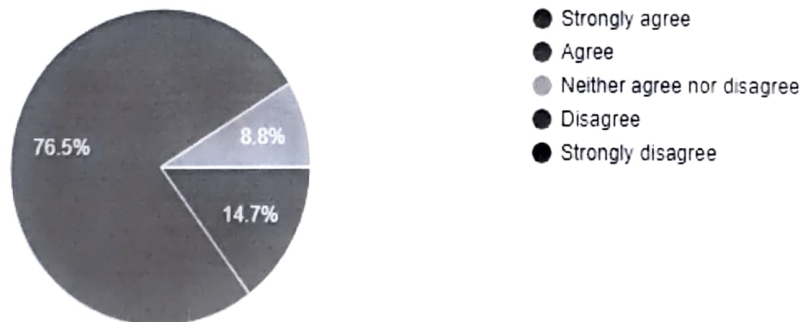

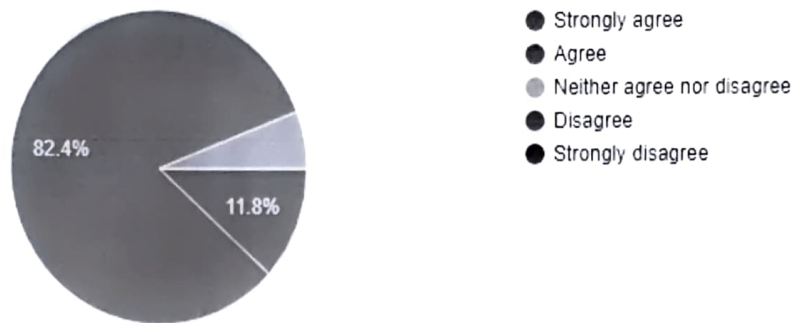

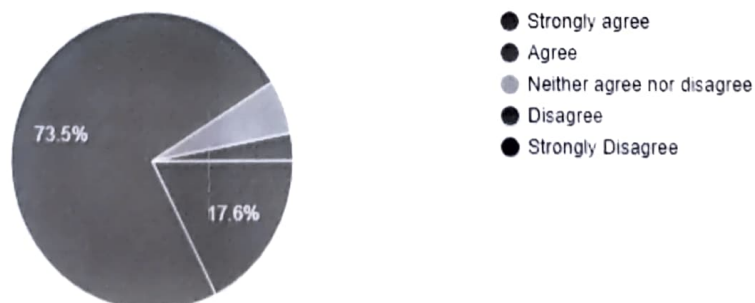

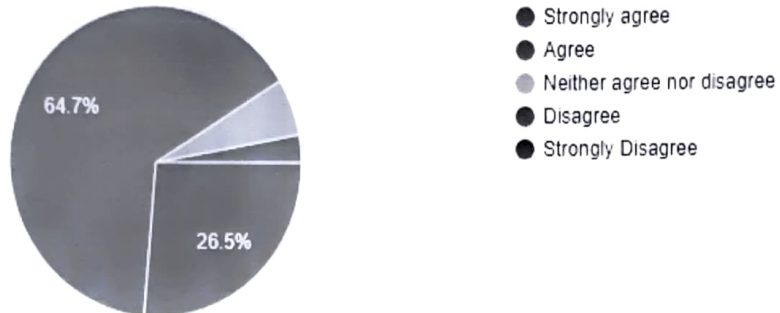

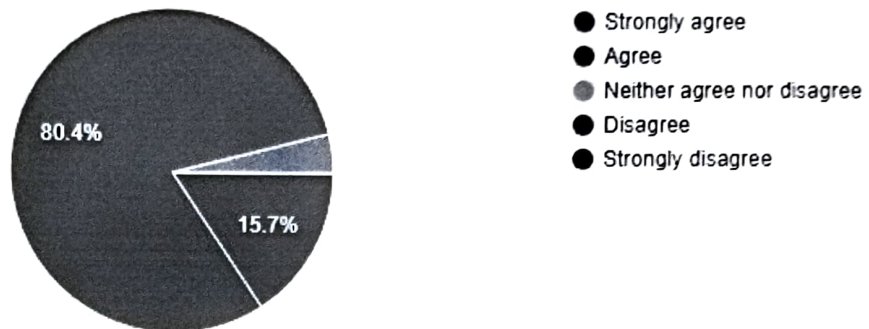

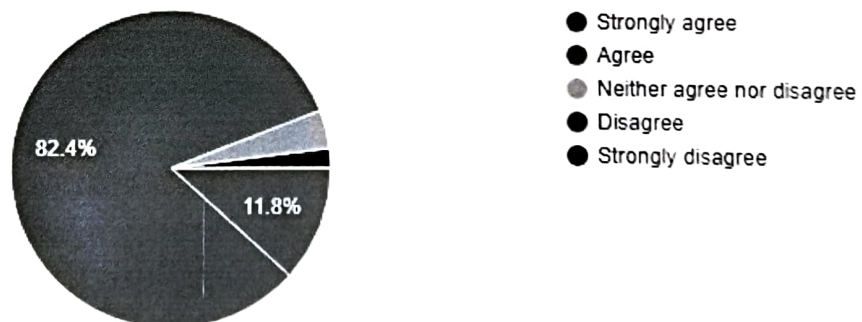

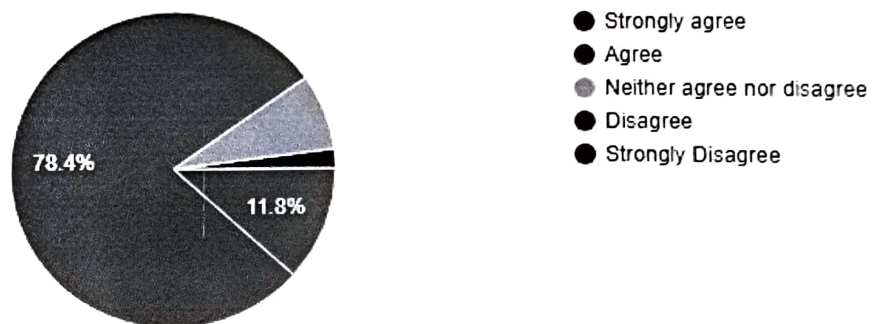

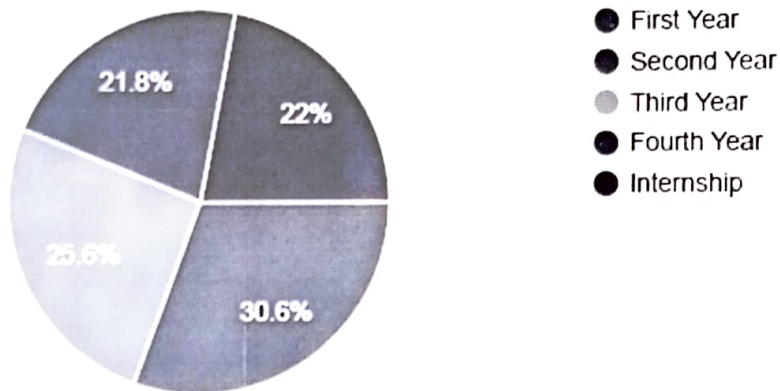

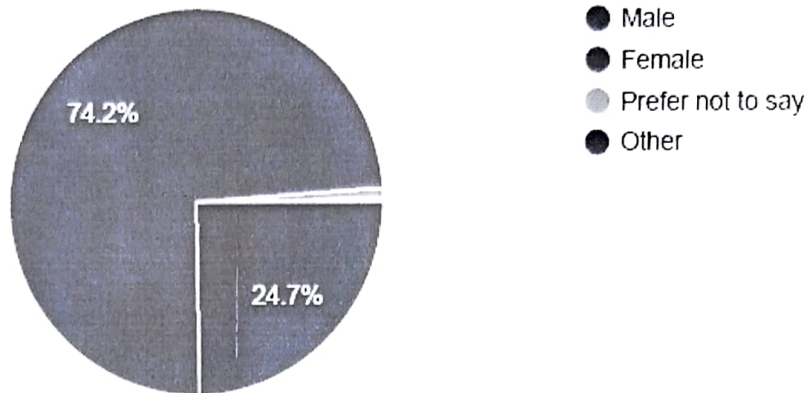

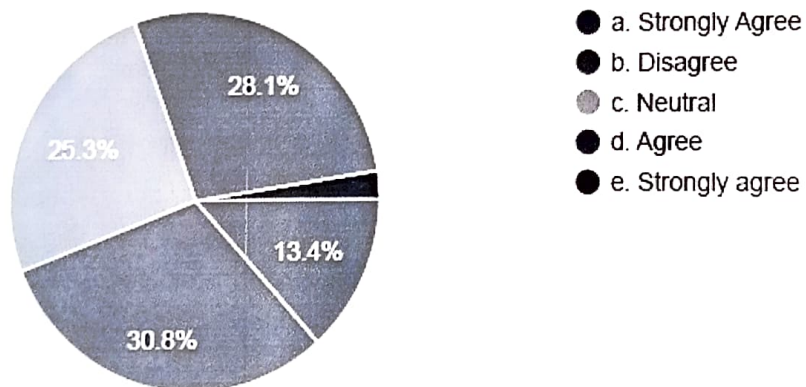

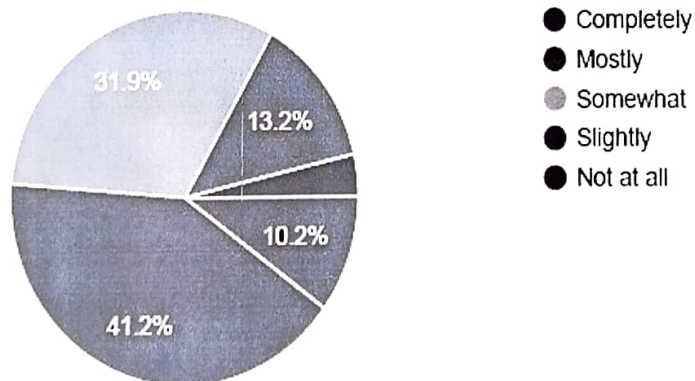

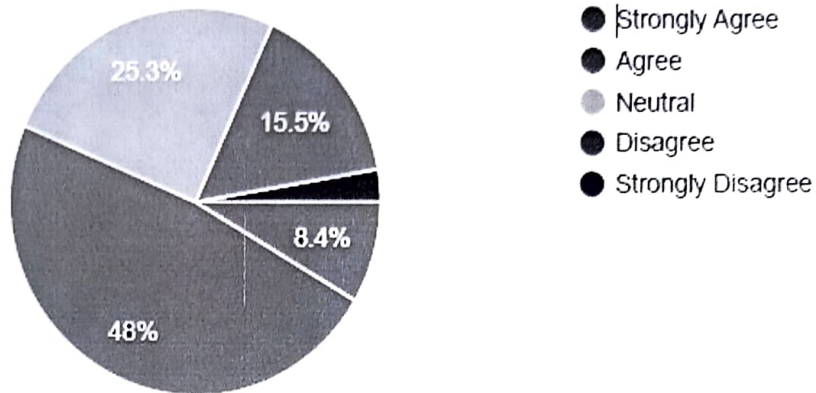

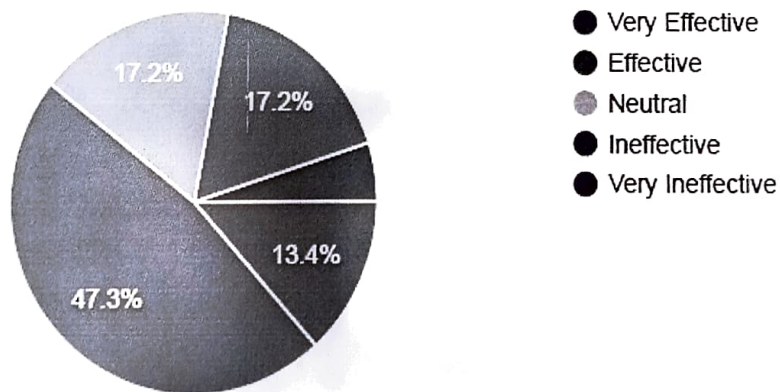

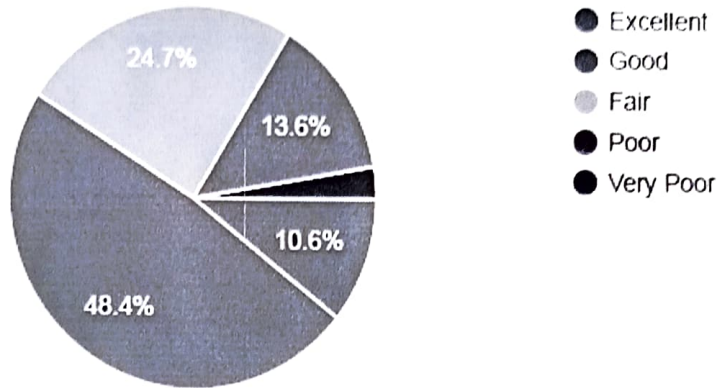

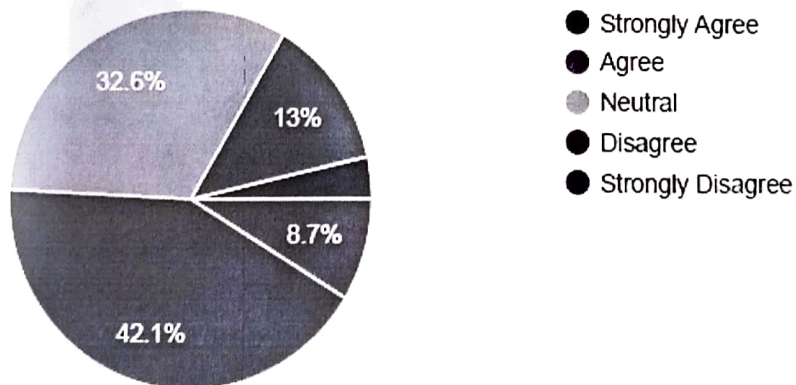

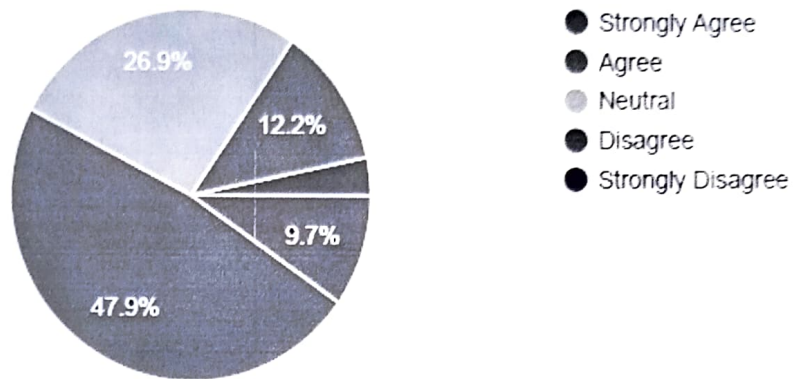

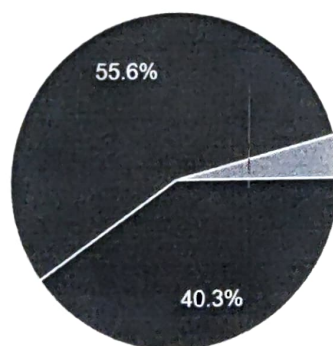

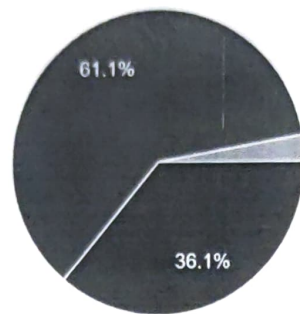

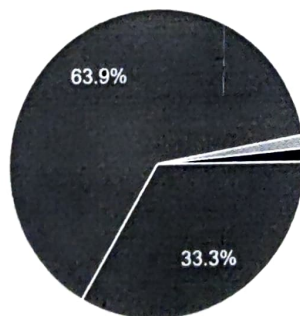

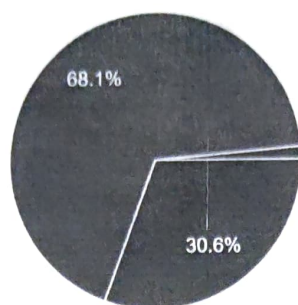

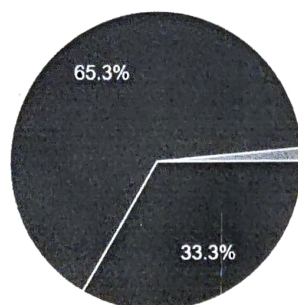

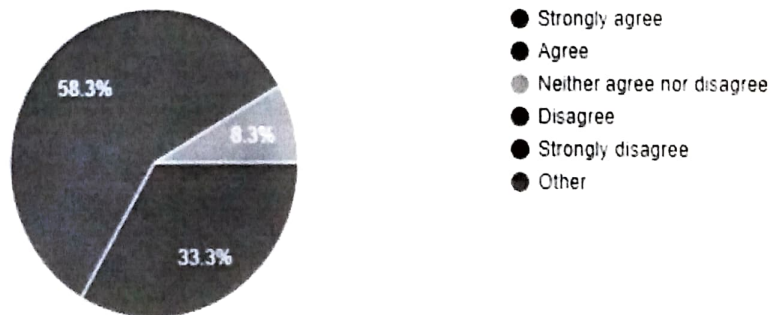

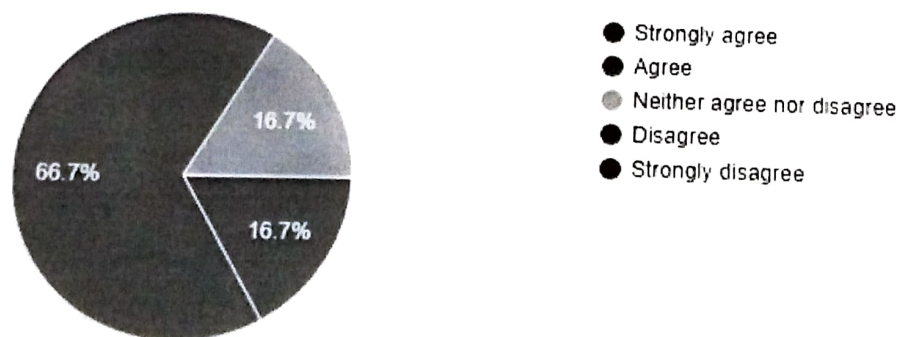

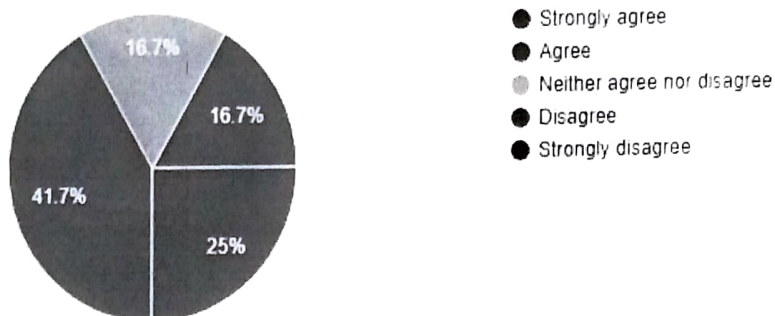

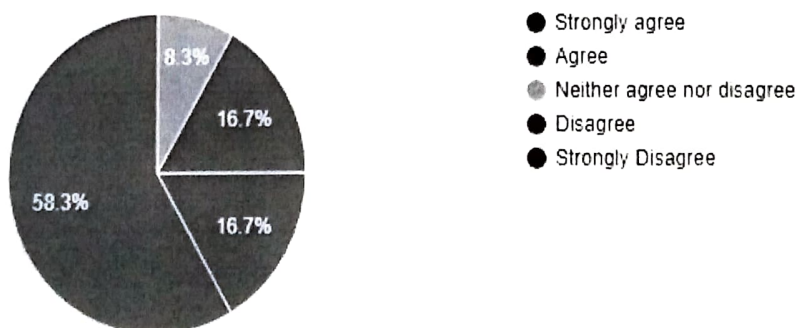



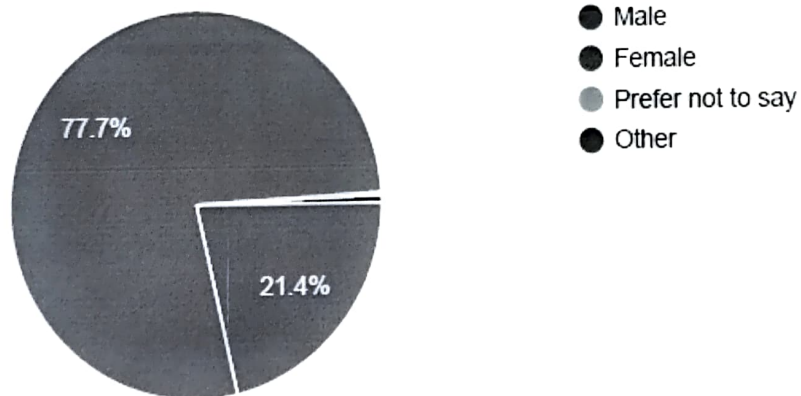

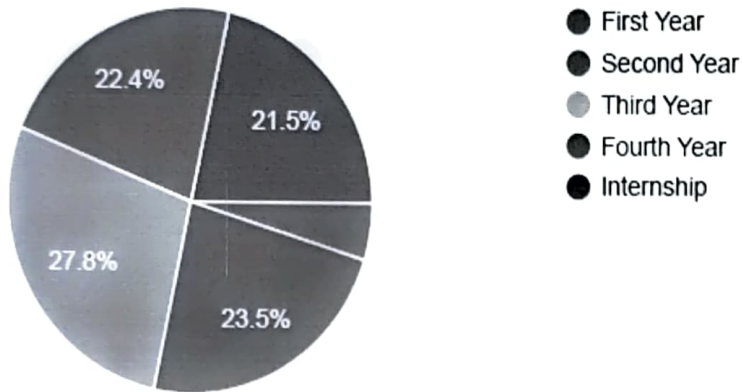

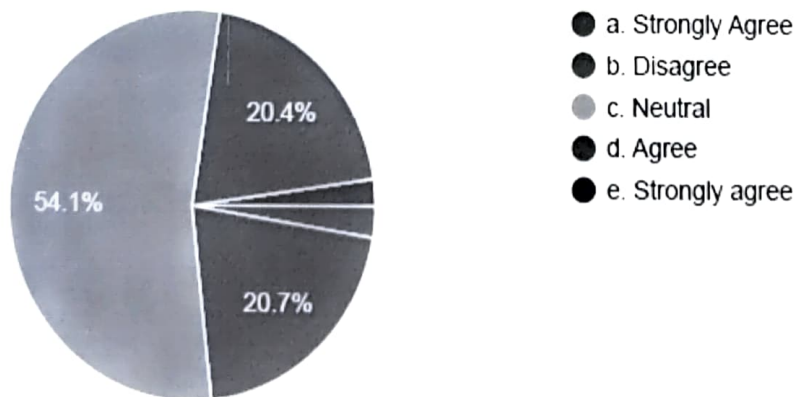

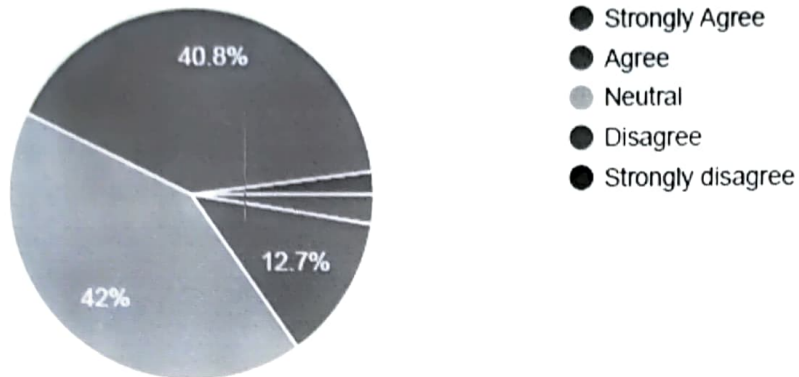

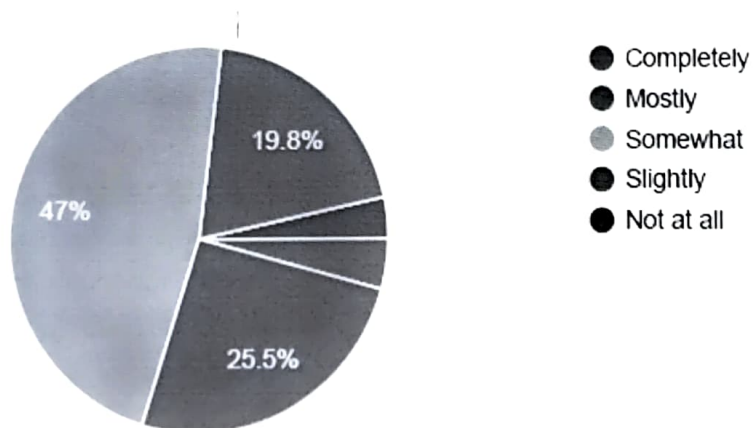

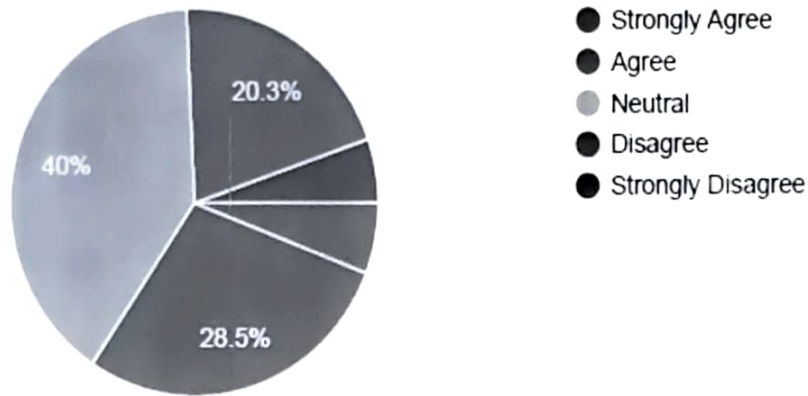

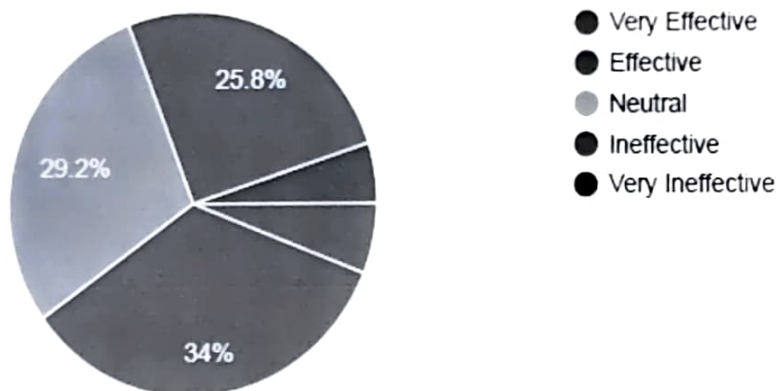

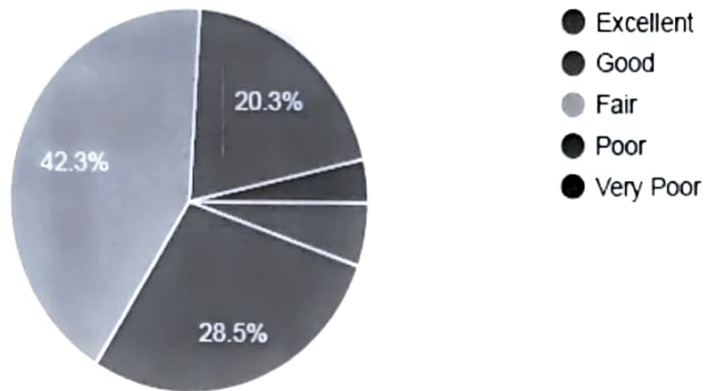

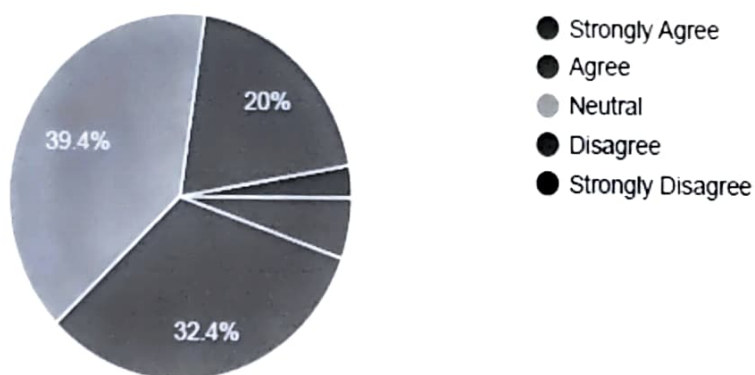

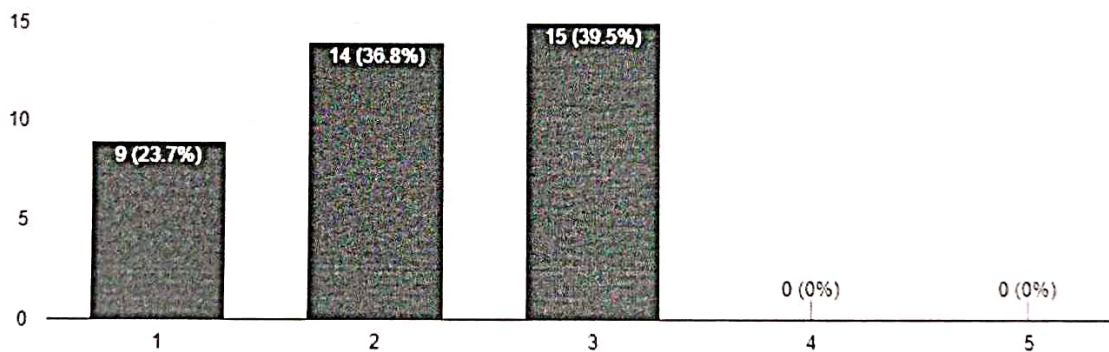

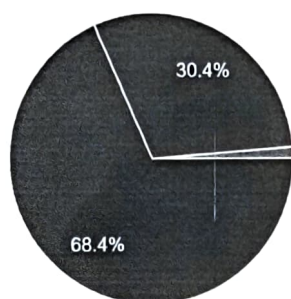

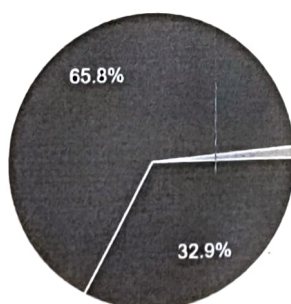

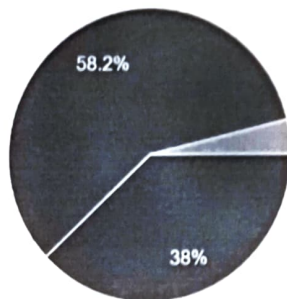

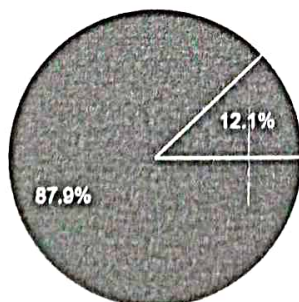

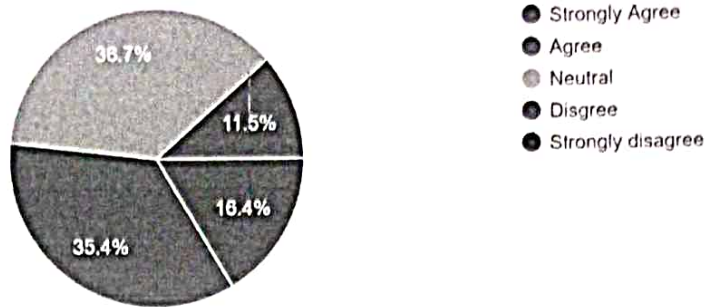

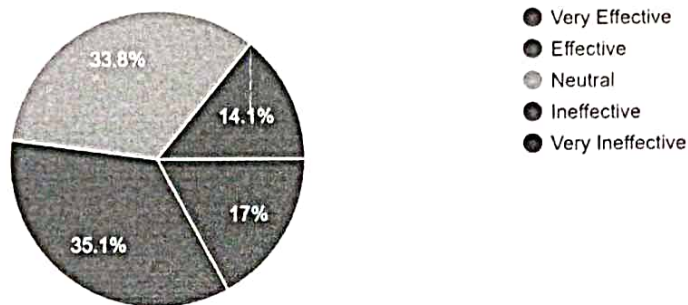

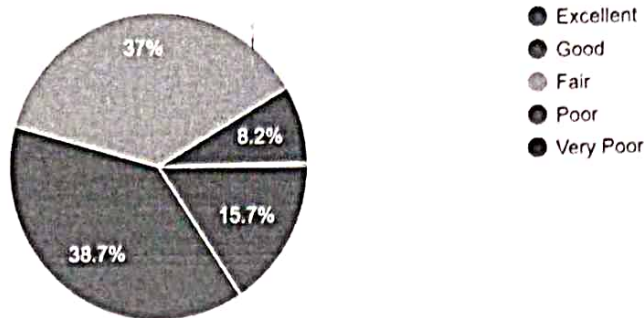

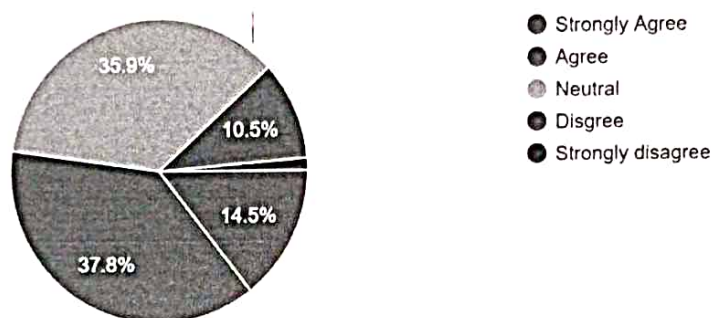

Curriculum has a good balance of theory and practical exposure.

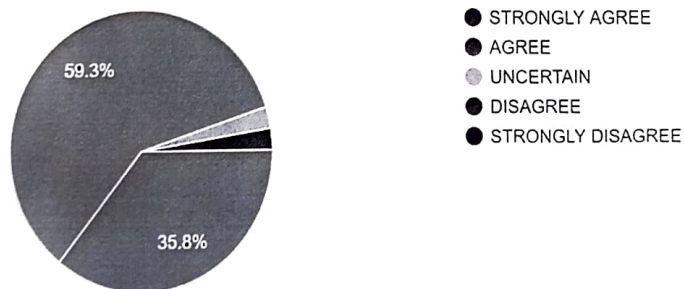

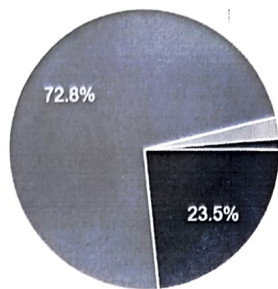

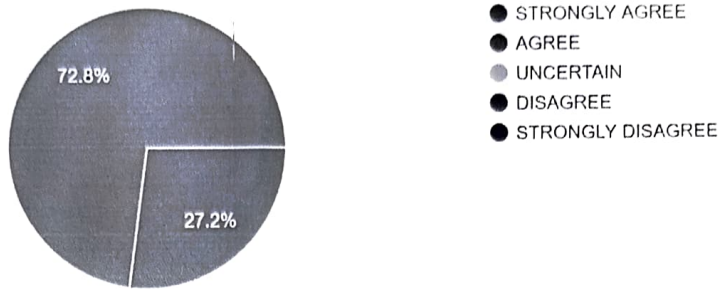

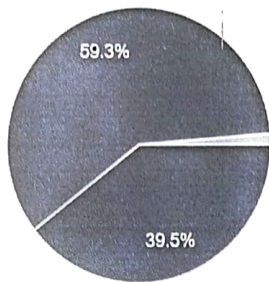

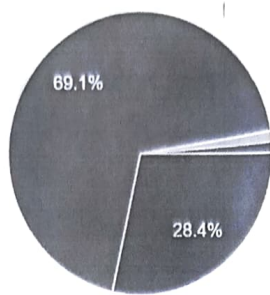

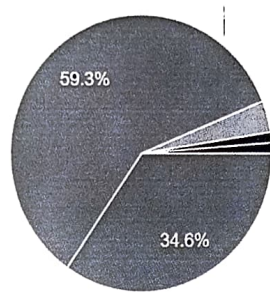
