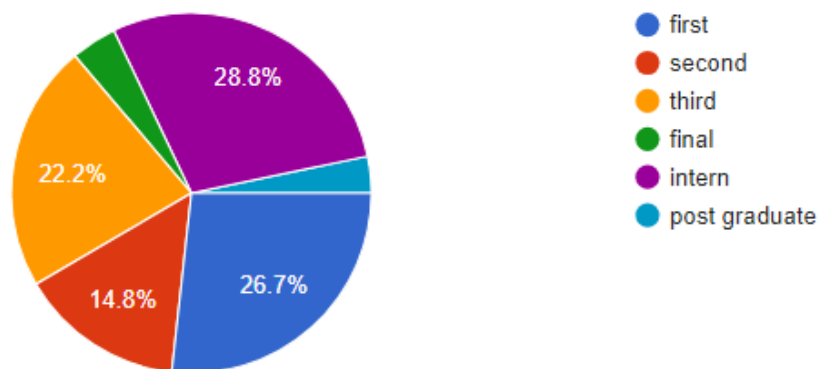

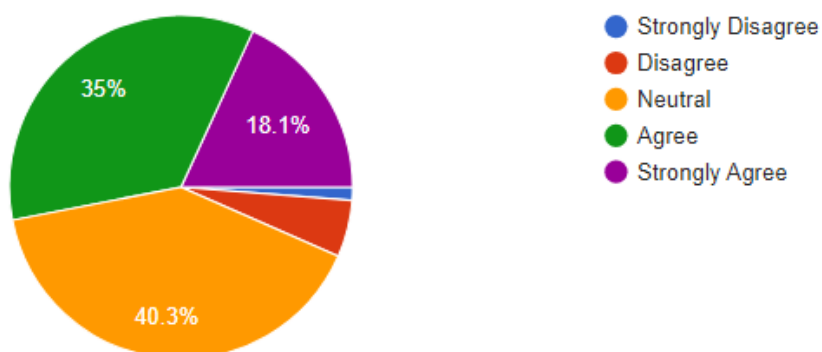

Clarity of explanations and instructions while teaching

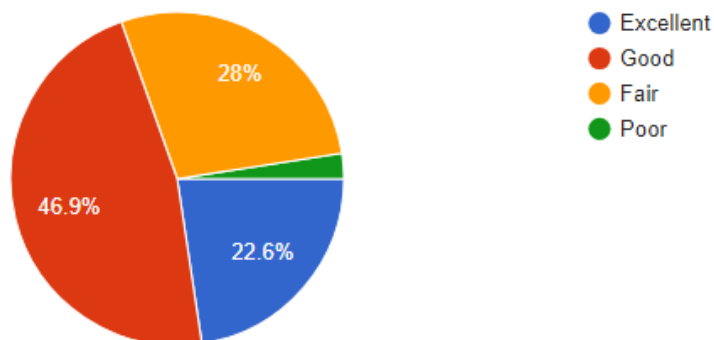

Punctuality of faculties for lectures and clinical assistance

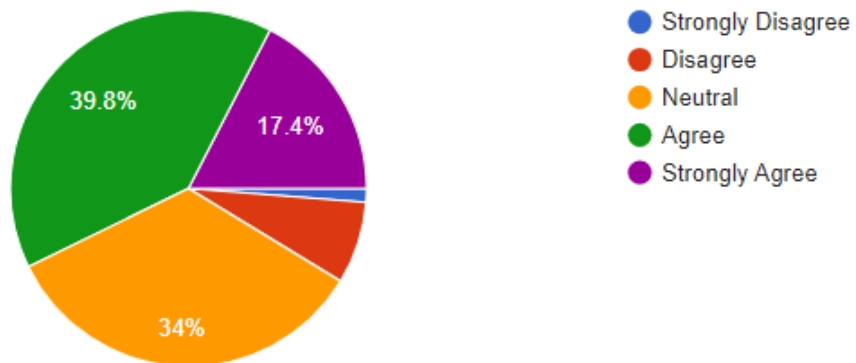

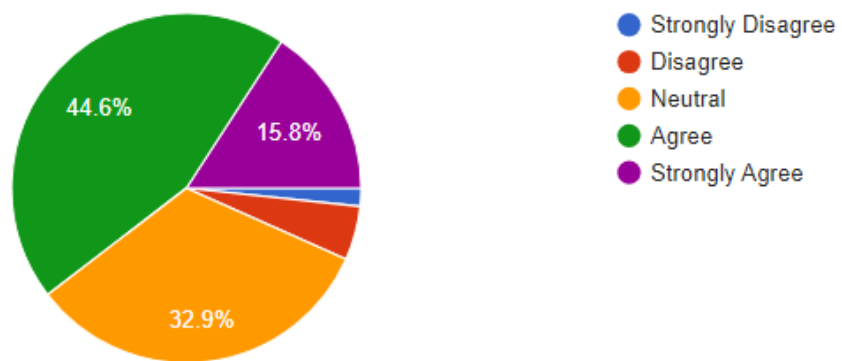

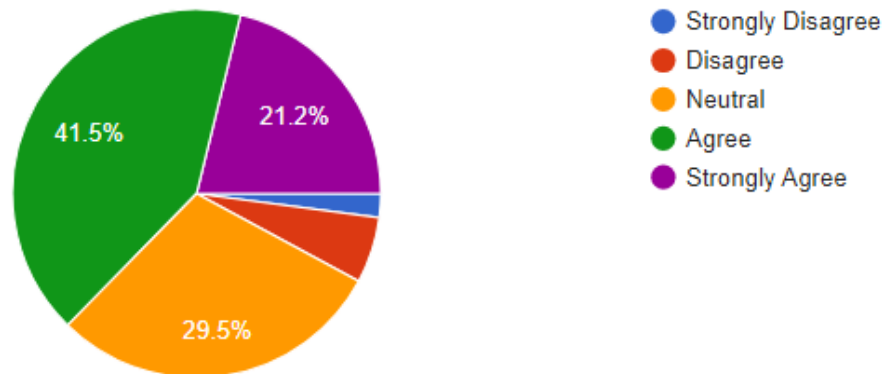

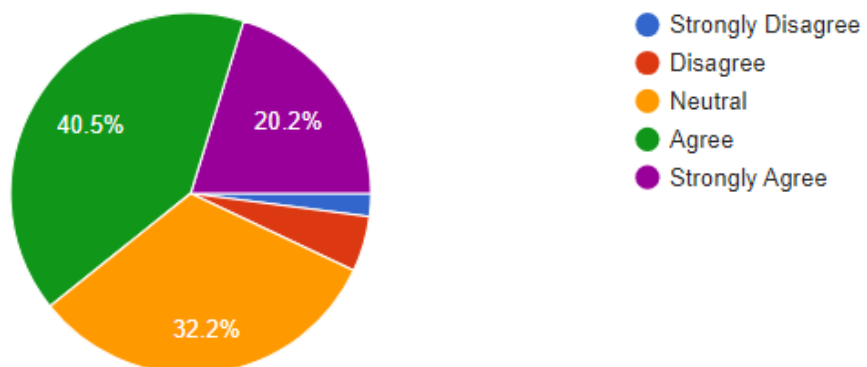

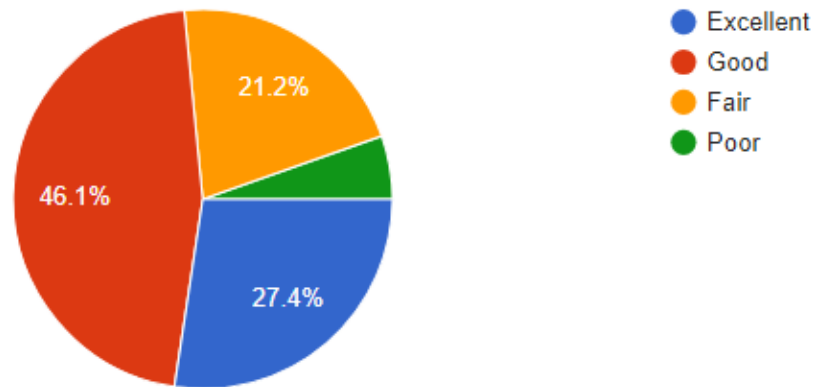

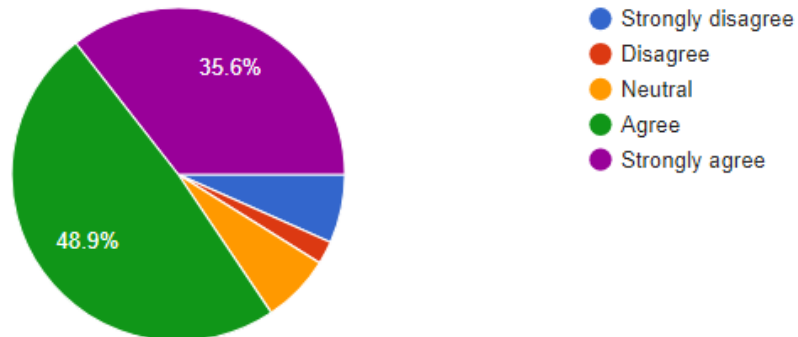

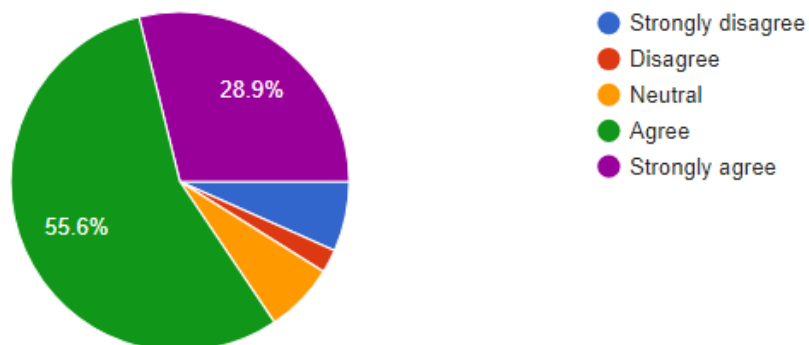

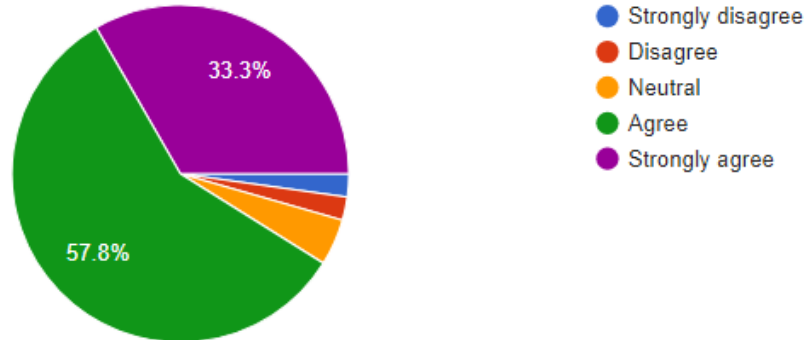

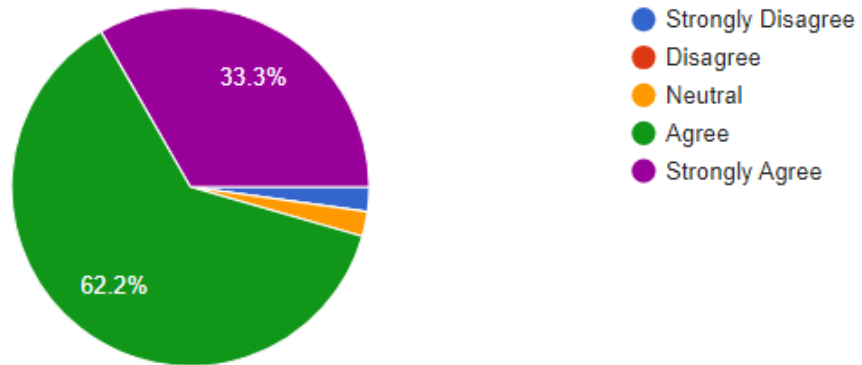

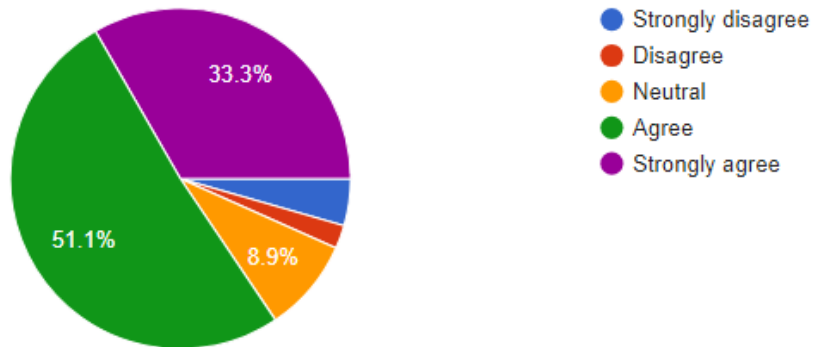

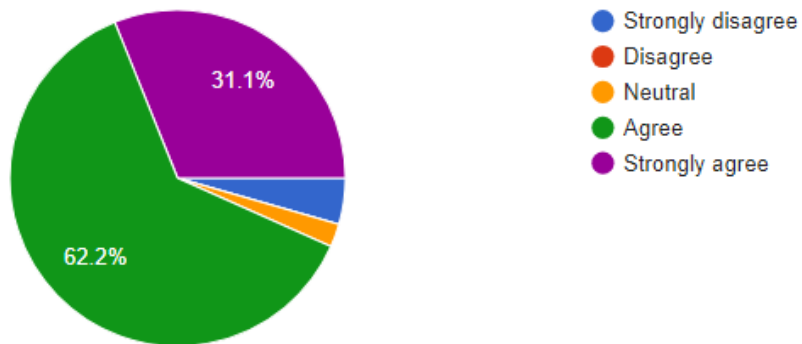

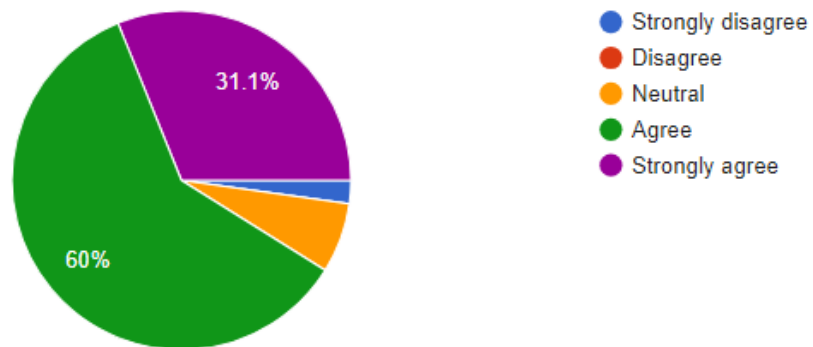

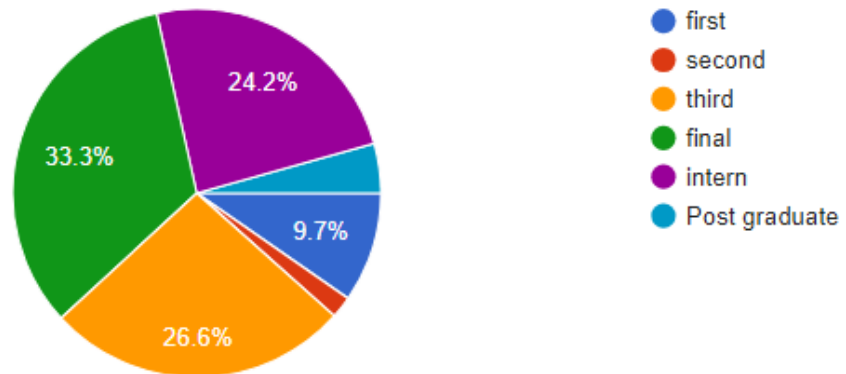

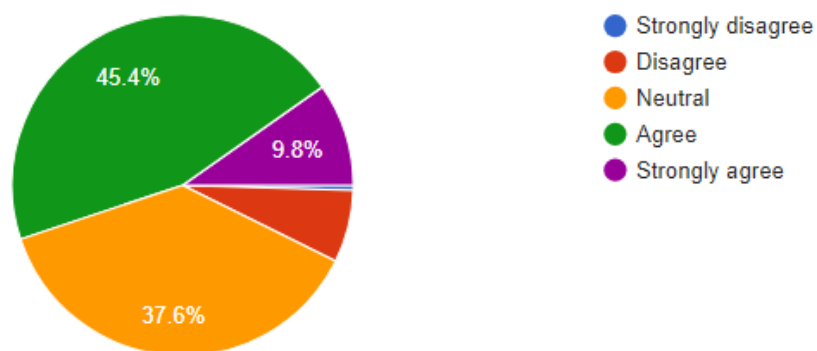

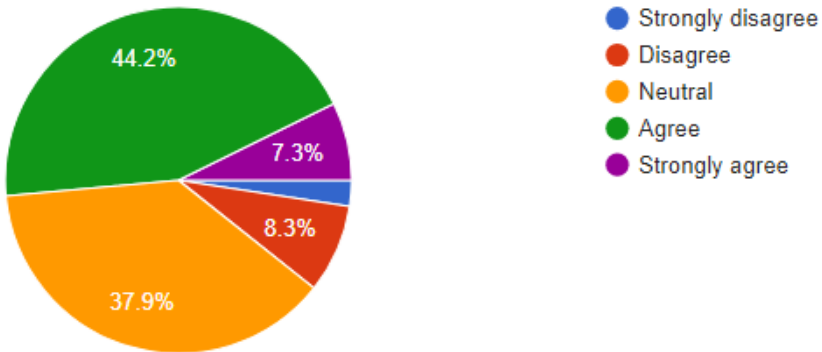

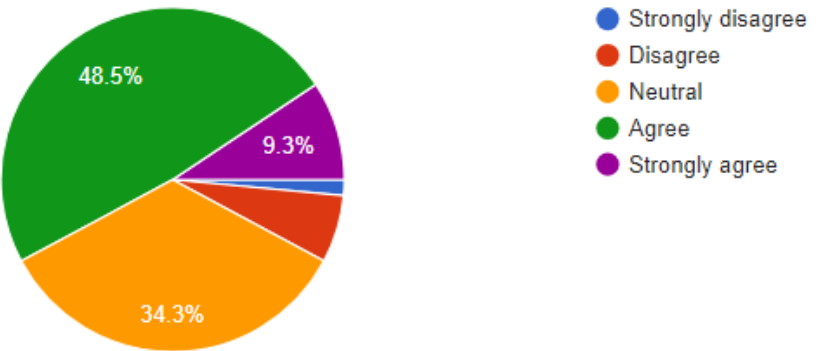

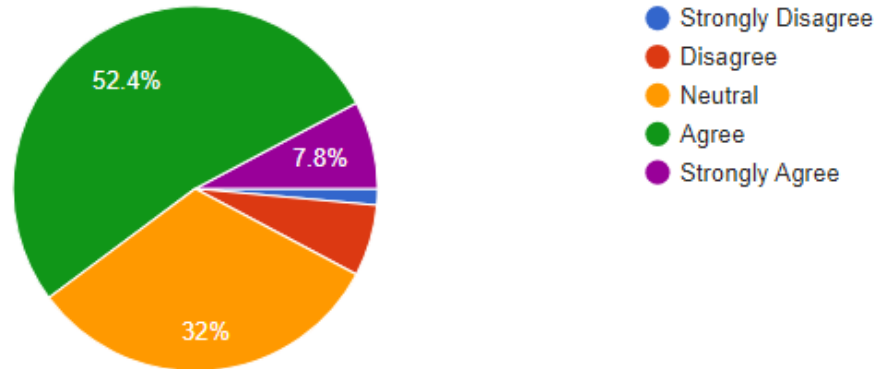

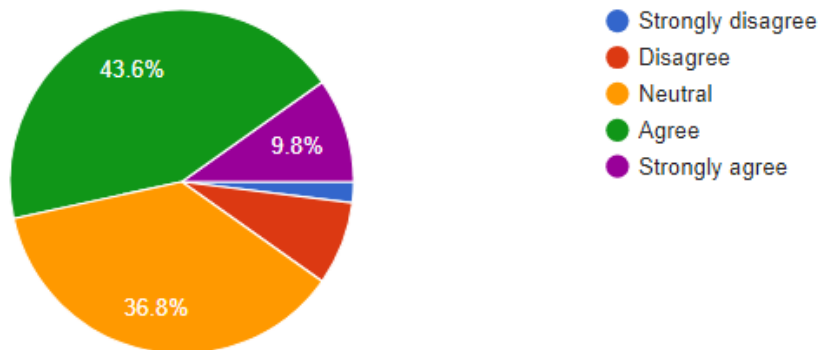

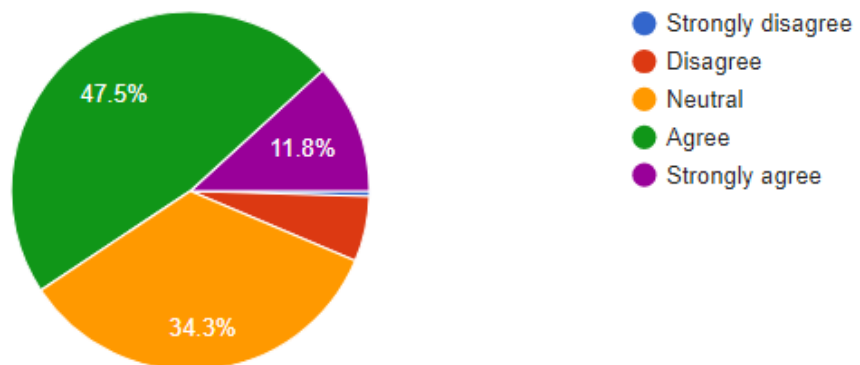

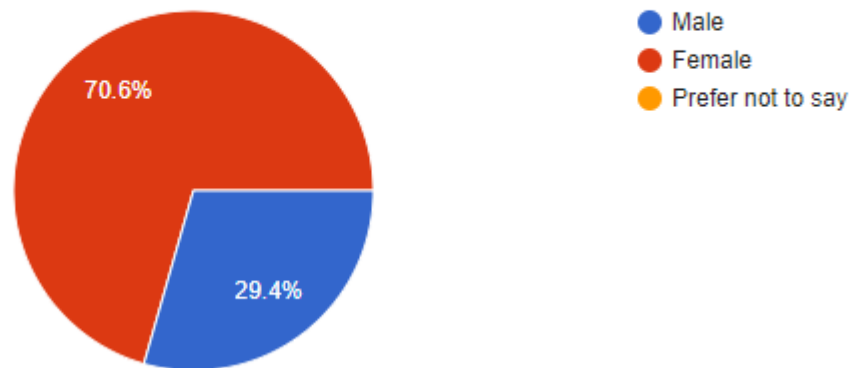

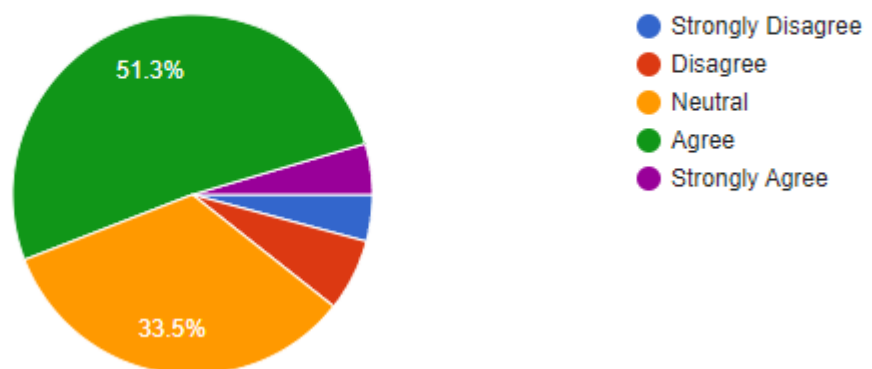

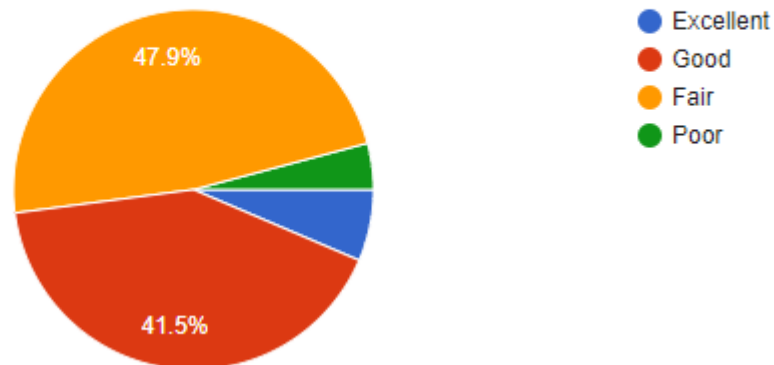

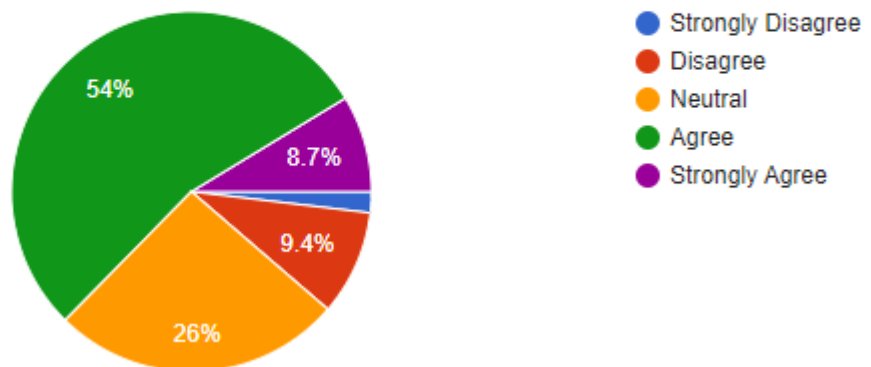

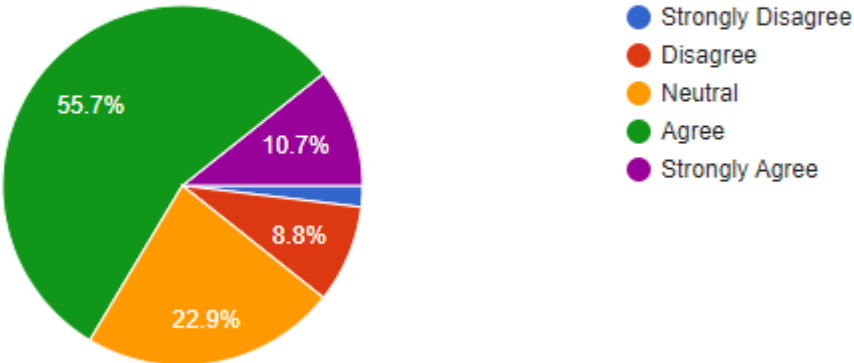

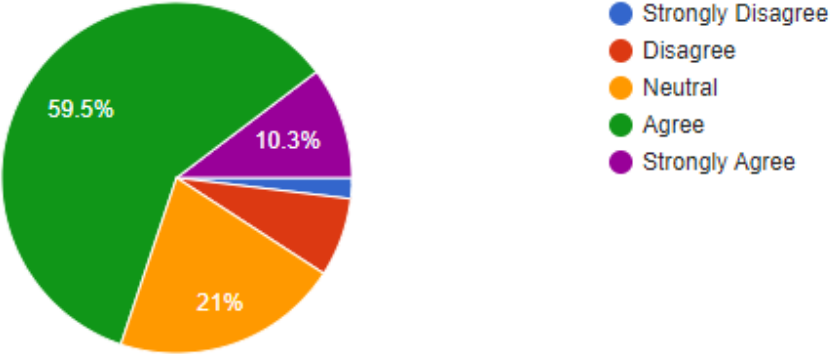

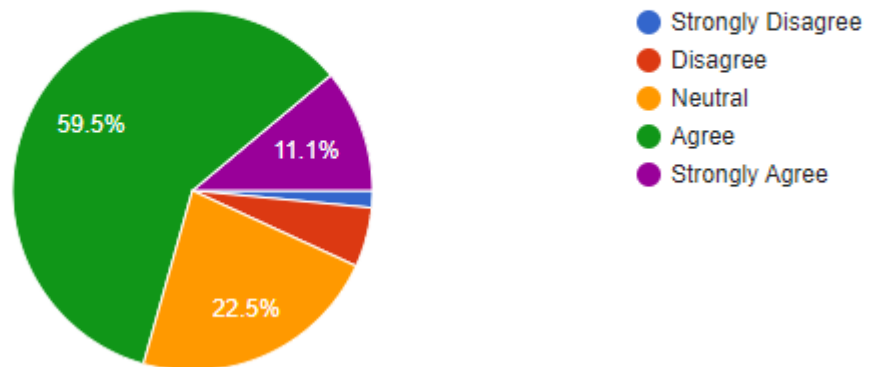

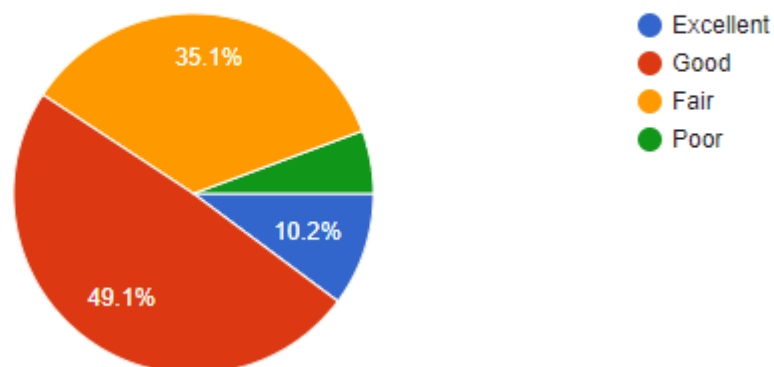

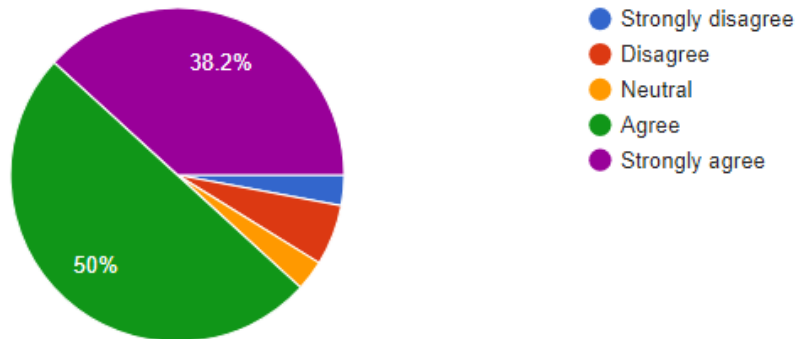

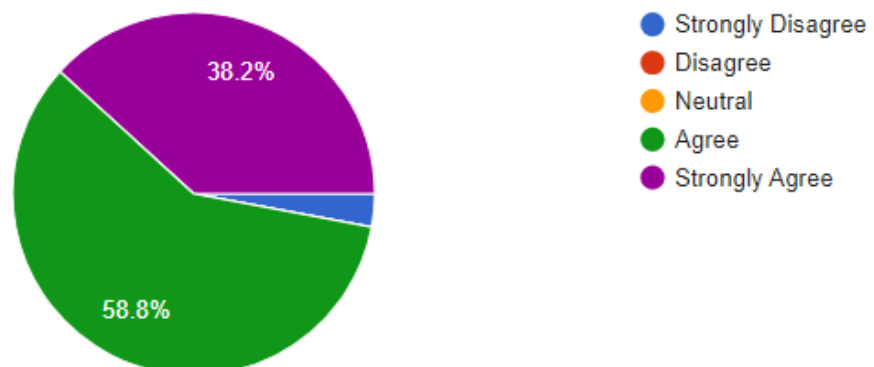

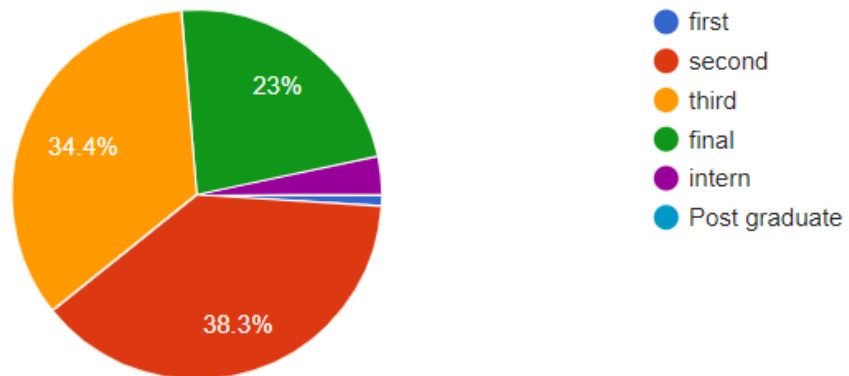

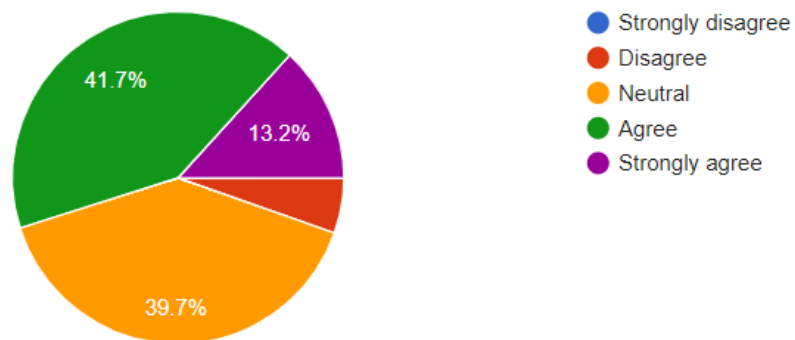

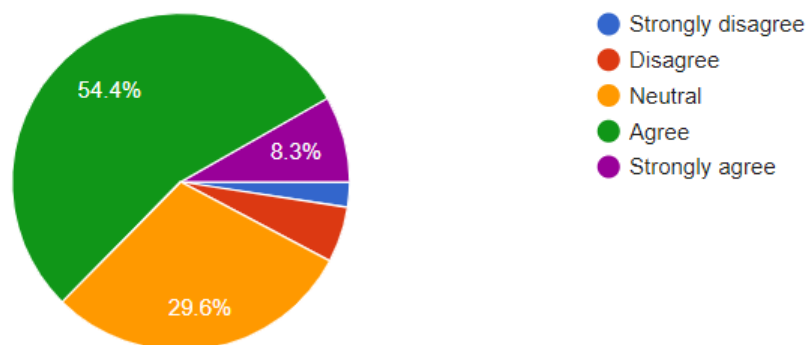

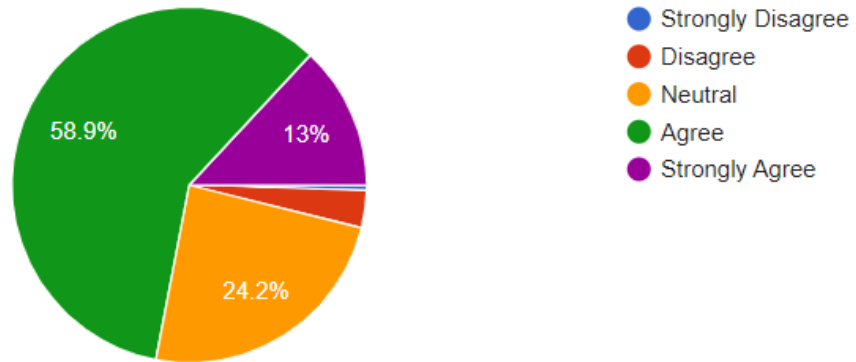

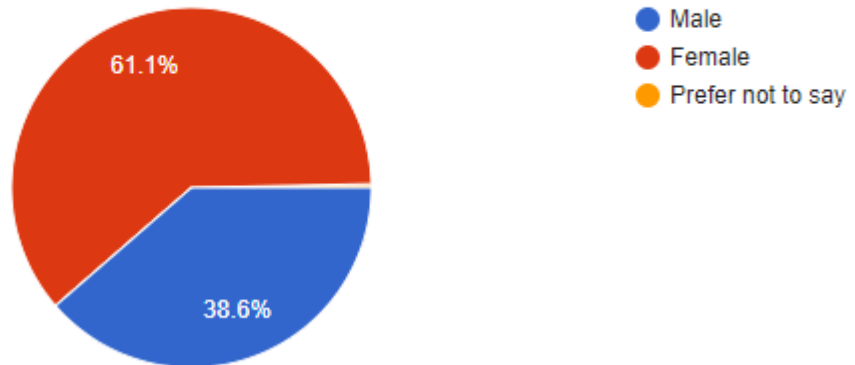

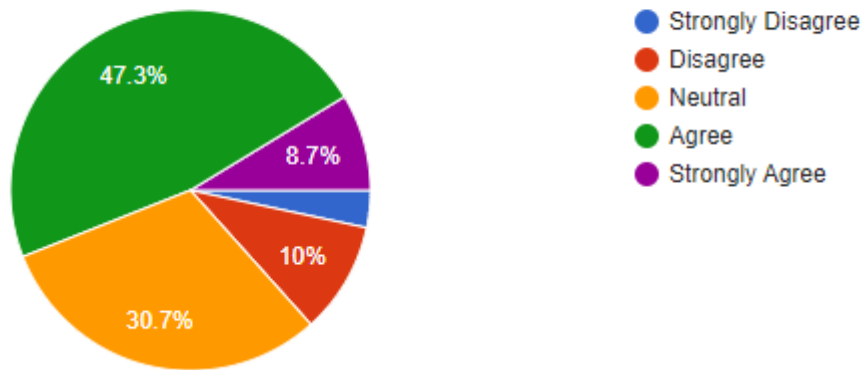

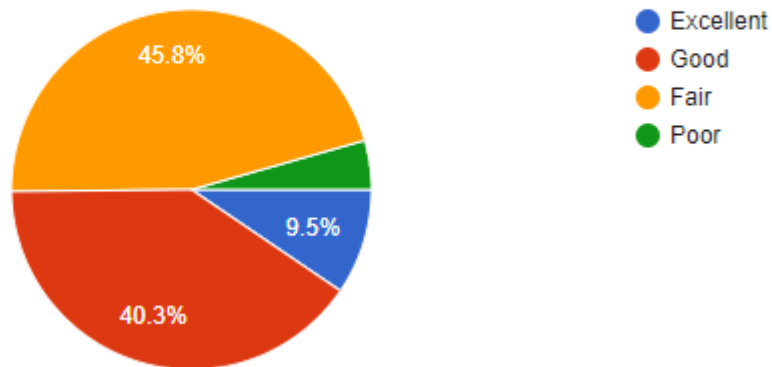

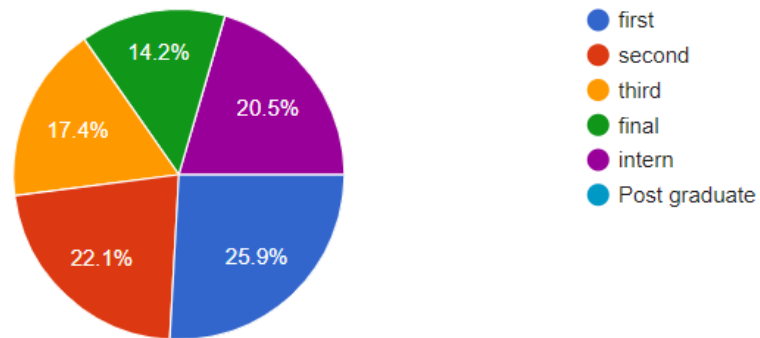

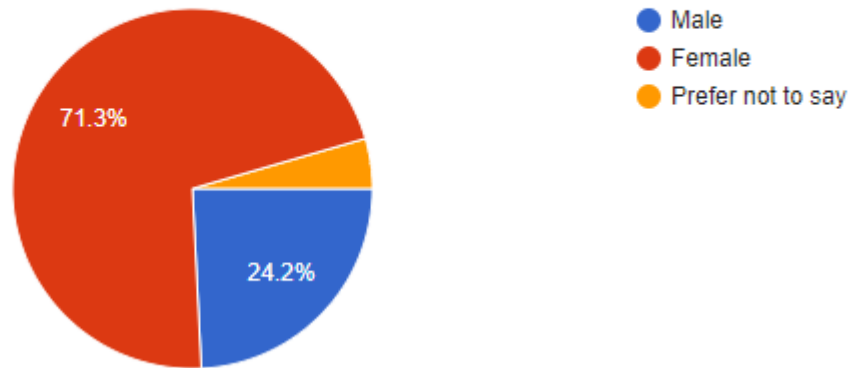

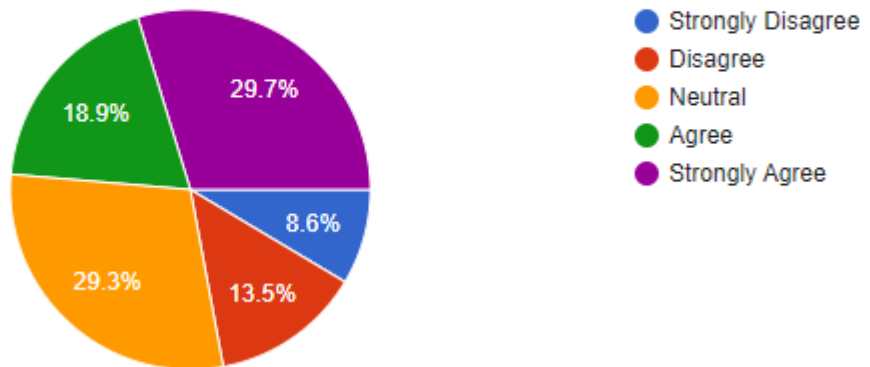

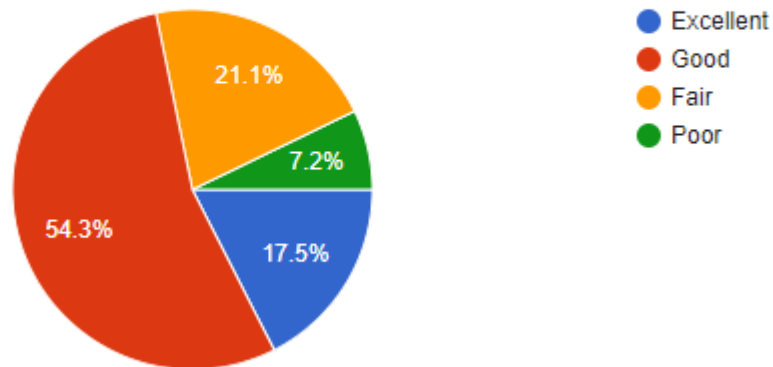

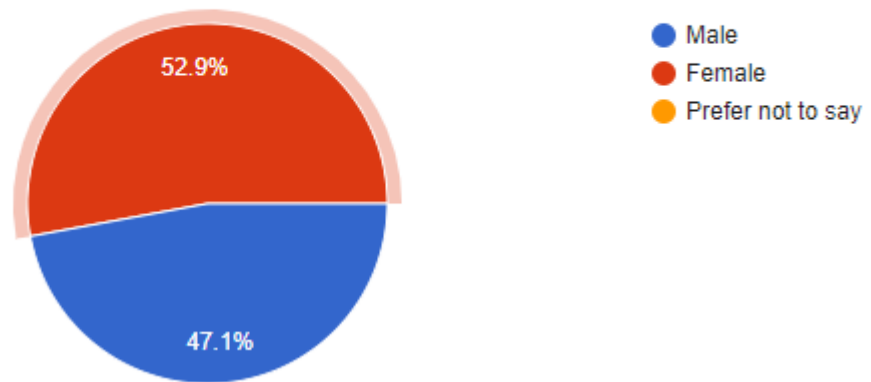

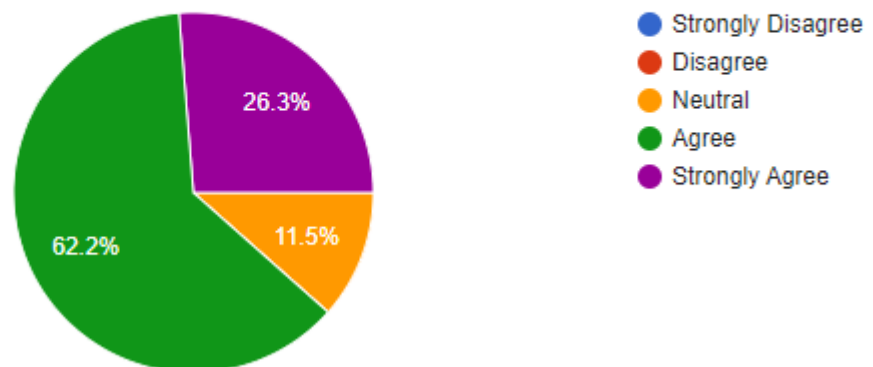

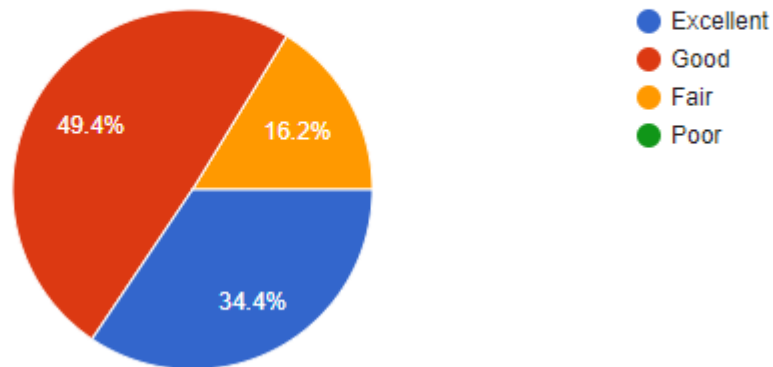

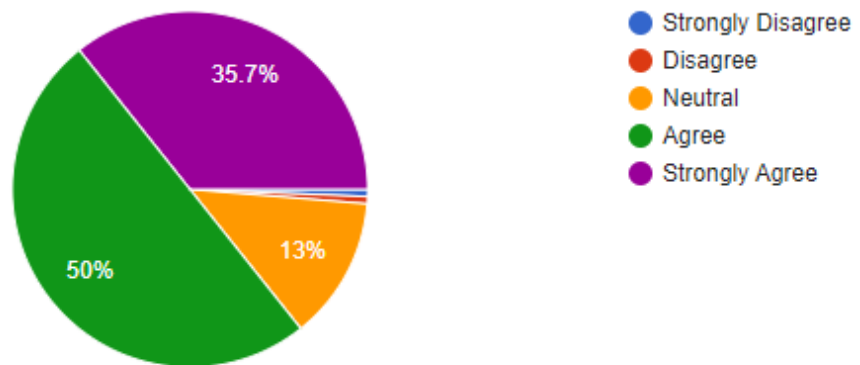

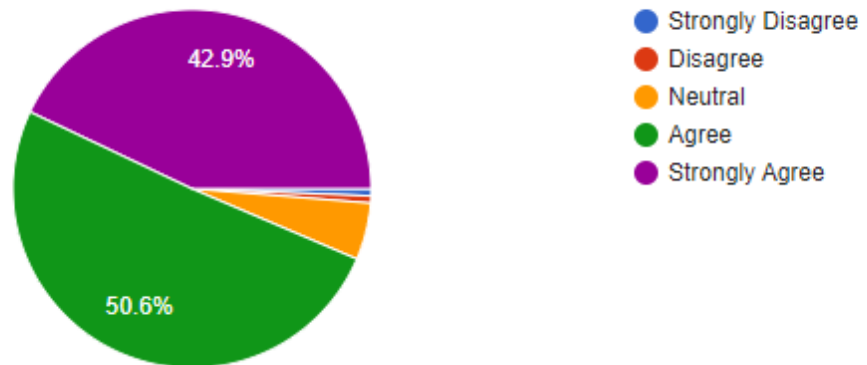

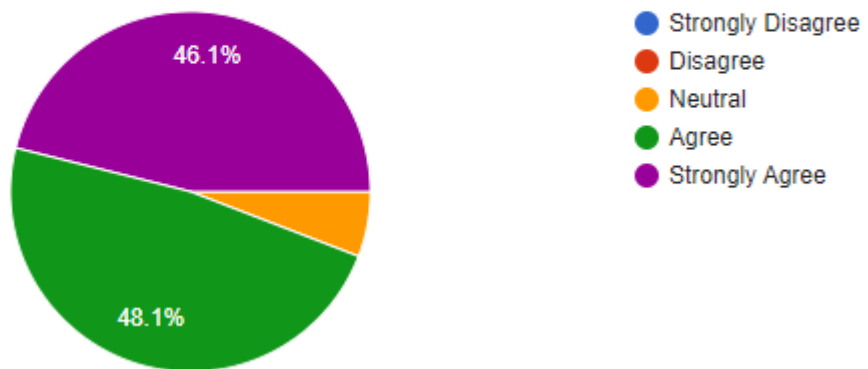

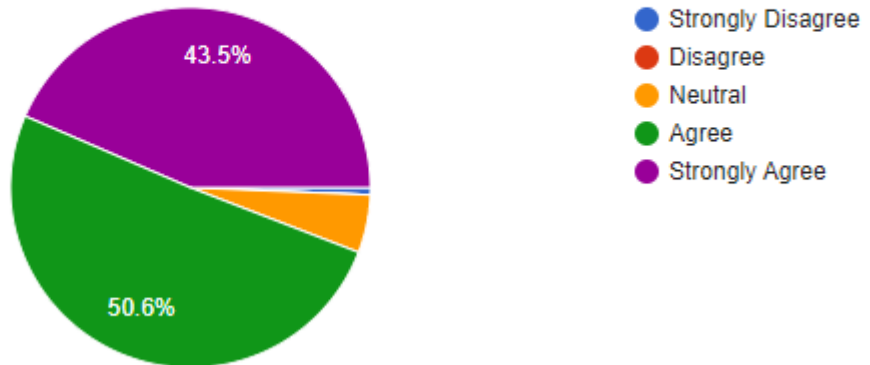

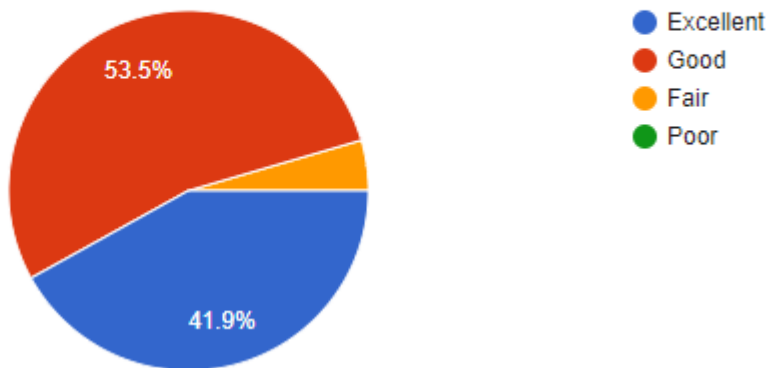

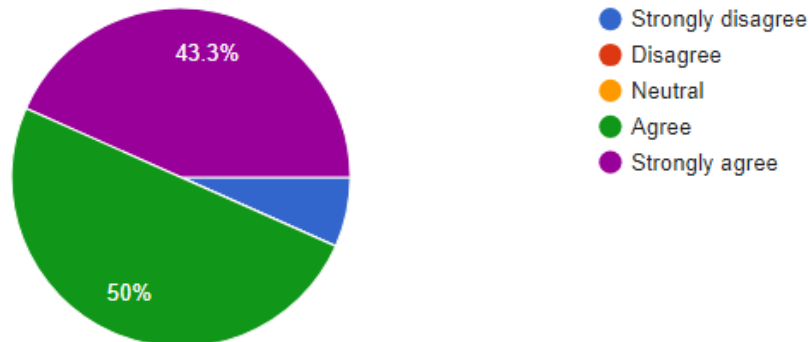

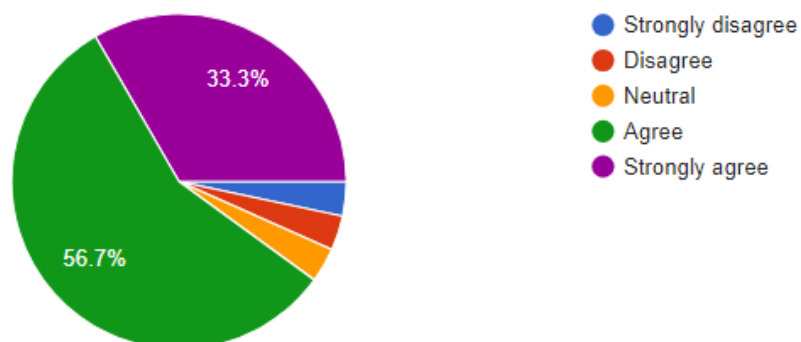

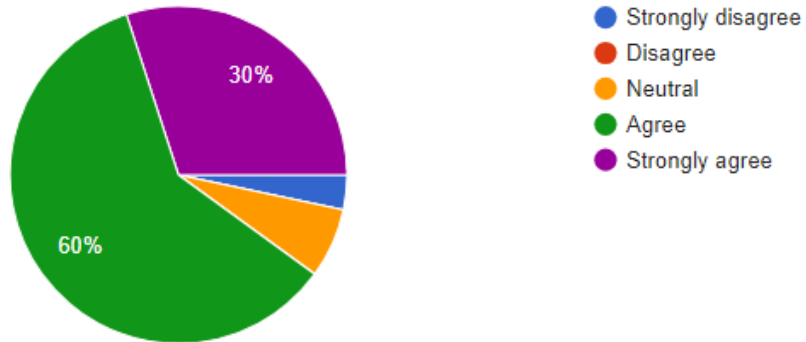

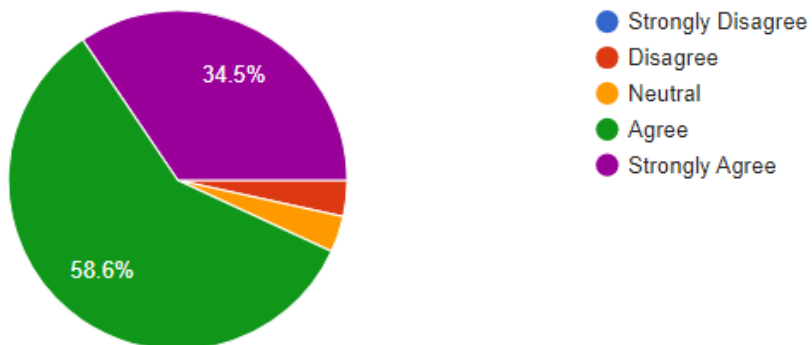

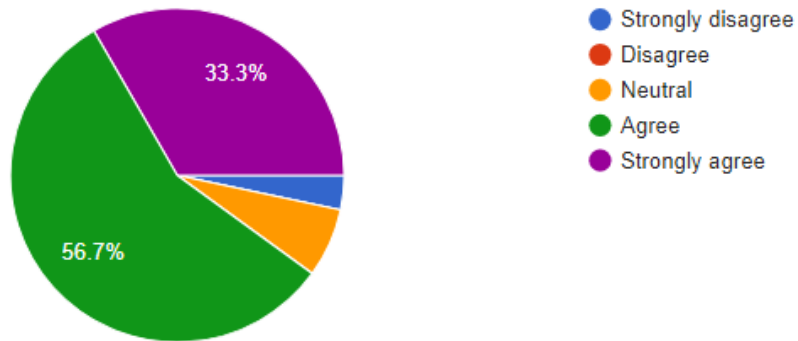

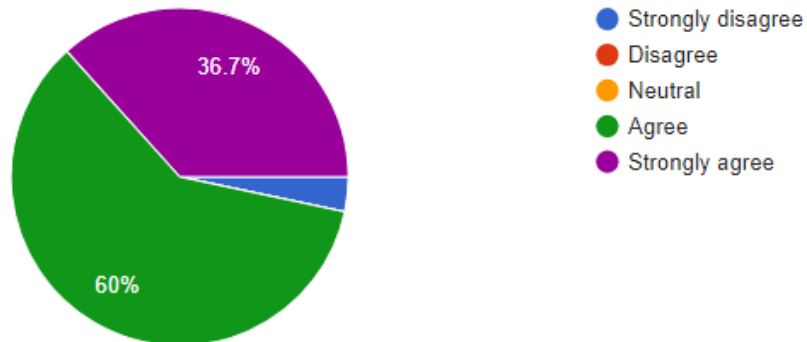

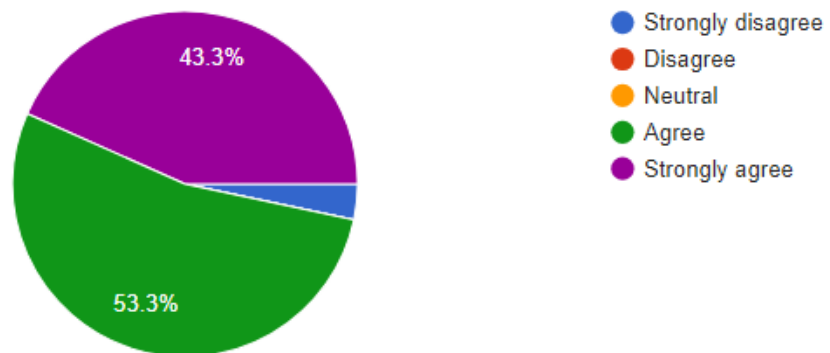

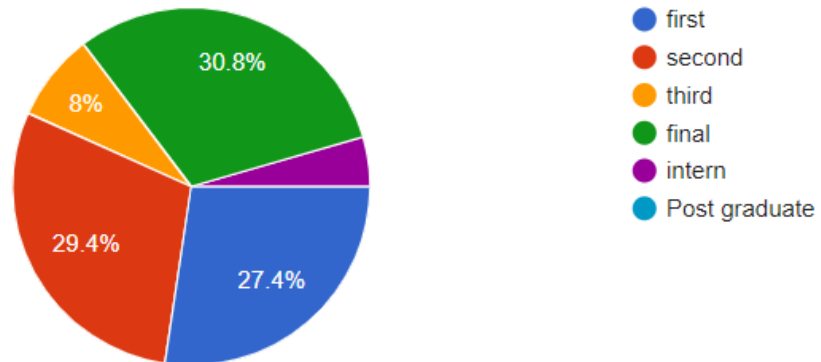

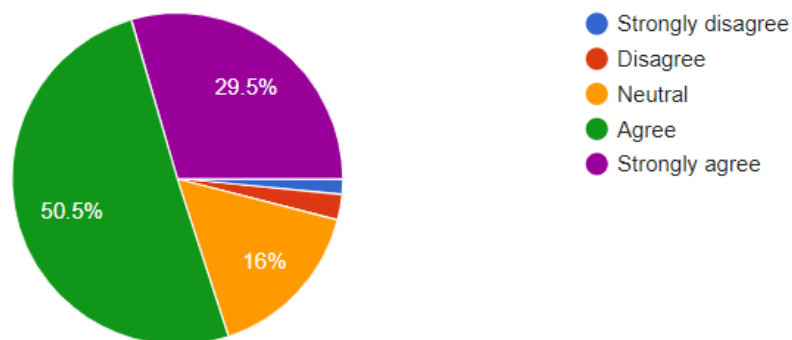

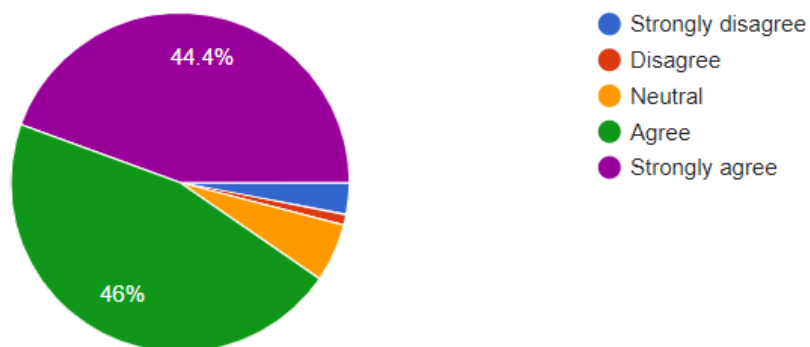
